Arson.

WANGANUI.—About 10.30 p.m. on the 13th instant an attempt was made to set fire to the stables of James S. Smiley, Victoria Avenue, but the flames were extinguished before much damage was done. An inquest was held on the 22nd instant, and a verdict of "Incendiarism against some person unknown" returned. The stock and stables were valued at £2,000, and insured for £825 only.

WELLINGTON.—*Re* Joseph Mason Foggan, charged with escaping from Mount Cook Prison: Offender shaved clean after his escape, and was dressed in a dark sac coat, faded green, light-tweed trousers, with a stripe of a different colour about $\frac{1}{2}$ in. wide running through the material, and a pair of gutta-percha sand shoes, all well worn. He expressed his intention of making for Auckland to join a Mrs. Nelson there. A man answering his description is reported to have called at the house of Mr. Robert Blair, Pahiatua, on the 19th instant, and left in the direction of Woodville.

Offences Not Otherwise Described.

AUCKLAND.—Edward Otway is charged on warrant with having, on the 27th ultimo, forged and uttered to Thomas Quoi a cheque for £25, purporting to be signed by Dr. Laishley, solicitor. Description: Supposed colonial, twenty-six years of age, 5ft. 6in. high, medium build, clean-shaved, dark complexion, dark hair, smart appearance, generally dressed in dark clothes and black hard-felt hat.

Inquest.

PATEA.—On the 13th ultimo the body of a man, name unknown, was found in the Patea River, a large piece of papa rock being securely tied round the waist, and at an inquest held on the same date, before Robert J. Adams, Esq., J.P., a verdict of "Found drowned" was returned. Deceased had been staying at the Masonic Hotel from the 27th March to the 3rd April, when he left very early in the morning. Description: A native of Devonshire, England, about fifty-eight years of age, partly bald, full grey beard whiskers and moustache, 5ft. 9in. or 10in. high, had on a pair of light-tweed trousers and waistcoat, and dark-tweed

coat. His effects consisted of a patched leather haversack, pair of spectacles in a wooden case, a metal corkscrew, and an old 'bus-ticket, on which the words "Gibson, proprietor," and "Waikato" are barely discernible. He spoke of having, during January and February last, camped near some hot-springs for the benefit of his health—supposed at Taupo, but may be Te Aroha or Rotorua. He appears to have been without means, and owed for a week's board when leaving the hotel.

"(Circular memorandum.)

"THE Ministers of the several departments concerned have authorised me to remind Clerks of Courts and members of the Police Force of the importance of accuracy in recording the names and ages of children sent to industrial schools. A circular on this subject was issued from this office in September, 1883.

"To illustrate the necessity for the writing of this memorandum, I may mention that recently, in the course of a few days, the following errors came to light: Names—Collett, for Kolet; Kilkolly, for Kilkolly; McGinaty, for McGinity; Maud Robbins, for Florence Maud Robin. Ages—14 years 8 months, for 15 years 5 months; 11 years 6 months, for 12 years 5 months; 10 years, for 9 years 6 months.

Prescribing a Close Season for Fish in the Blake River, or Waimea Creek, Westland.

GLASGOW, Governor.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this ninth day of May, 1895.

Present:

THE HONOURABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, among other things, enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and revoke regulations (which shall have force and effect only in any waters or places specified therein) providing for, among other things, the more effectual protection and improvement of "fish," as defined by the said Act, and for setting apart any river or other fresh or salt waters for the natural or artificial propagation of fish, and for prohibiting for any period fishing in any waters, river, or stream in which young fish or spawn have been placed or deposited:

And whereas it is expedient to make the regulations hereinafter set forth with respect to fish liberated, inhabiting,

or found in the waters of the Blake River, otherwise known as the Waimea Creek, in the County of Westland :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto ; and with the like advice and consent doth order that such regulations shall take effect on and after the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, and shall have force and effect in that portion of the Blake River, otherwise known as the Waimea Creek, defined in the said regulations.

SCHEDULE.

REGULATIONS.

1. ALL that portion of the Blake River, otherwise known as the Waimea Creek, in the County of Westland, extending from half a mile above the point at which the Christchurch Road crosses the said river to one mile and a half below the said point (the said river being a stream in which salmon and trout have been liberated), is hereby set apart for the natural or artificial propagation of fish.
2. No person shall fish for, take, or catch any fish in the above-described portion of the said river or creek within a period of two years from the date of the publication hereof.
3. Any person committing a breach of the above regulation shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £1 and not exceeding £50.
4. Every penalty imposed by these regulations may be recovered in a summary manner before any two or more Justices of the Peace.
