# Offences Not Otherwise Described.

AUCKLAND.—Edward Otway is charged on warrant with having, on the 27th April last, forged and uttered to Thomas Quoi a cheque for £25, purporting to be signed by Dr. Laishley, solicitor. Description: Supposed colonial, twenty-six years of age, 5ft. 6in. high, medium build, clean-shaved, dark complexion, dark hair, smart appearance, generally dressed in dark clothes and black hard-felt hat.
