Offences Not Otherwise Described.

Dunedin.—Frederick Thomas Horne is charged on warrant with having, on the 14th August, 1895, embezzled £100, money of the Dunedin Finance, Loan, and Agency Company (Limited). Description: English or Colonial, about thirty-four years of age, rather stout, square build, sallow complexion, dark-brown hair, and short heavy dark moustache only; respectable appearance; generally wears a dark-tweed sac-suit and hard black hat. Offender, who was employed as clerk to the company, received the above amount, and converted it to his own use. His defalcations amount to over £1,000. He was also secretary to the St. Cleir Trotting Club, and is pretty well known to racing men. His wife and child reside at Caversham, and he will no doubt endeavour to leave the colony. Arrest important.

Description: English, an ex-constable, thirty-seven years of age, 6ft. 2in. high, fresh complexion, brown hair and eyes, long nose, large mouth, sharp chin. He served in the Armed Constabulary from 27th February to 24th September, 1880, when he was discharged at Taranaki, and subsequently joined the New South Wales police. His wife and child (boy) left Goulburn for Sydney about three weeks ago, supposed en route to New Zealand to meet him. Mrs. Webb is a native of the North of England, about thirty years of age, medium height, slight build, black hair and eyes, pale complexion, usually wears a dark dress, long grey cloak, and black-straw hat. Offender is English, a sailor and mill-hand, nineteen years of age, 5ft. 6in. high, slight build, dark complexion, long features, no hair on face; dressed in white pants, dark coat, black cap, and has his swag in a sailor's canvas bag.

Deserting Wives and Families, &c.

PALMERSTON NORTH.—Frank Hubble is charged on warrant with deserting his illegitimate child by Agnes Moles since the 16th ultimo. Description: Supposed English, about thirty years of age, about 5ft. 7½ in. high, stout build, dark complexion, clean shaved except moustache; has been a sailor, and until recently was employed in the telephone-office at Palmerston North. He is known in Wellington, and may visit Dunedin, where his mother resides.

PAEROA.—William Dixon is charged on warrant with failing to provide for the maintenance of his illegitimate child by Hannah Pennell. Description: Colonial, a jockey, about twenty-three years of age, about 5ft. 6in. high, slight build, fresh complexion, brown hair and moustache only, grey or light-blue eyes, smart appearance; usually wears a dark suit and black hard-felt hat. Was seen in Auckland on the 23rd instant. His brother works for the Hon. J. D. Ormond, at Hastings.

Description: A native of Napier, a baker, twenty-nine years of age, 5ft. 8in. high, dark hair, brown eyes, broad shoulders, good appearance, clean shaved except moustache, fond of smiling and showing his teeth; wore a dark-tweed suit. Last heard of at Bulls. He was £3 5s. in arrears on the 5th ultimo.

RAKAIA.—Joseph Brimmicombe is charged on warrant with failing to provide for the future maintenance of his unborn illegitimate child by Emma Murray. Description: A native of New Zealand, twenty-five years of age, 5ft. 10in. high, strong build, fair complexion and hair, small fair moustache, otherwise clean shaved, scar above and below left eye, one front upper tooth broken, left arm crooked; dressed in grey-tweed coat and vest, navy-blue trousers and light-coloured soft-felt hat. Has relatives in Christchurch, Wellington, and Pahiatua.

TEMUKA.—Thomas Radford is charged on warrant with neglecting to contribute towards the support of his illegitimate child by Alice Tawdry. Description: A native of New Zealand, twenty-three years of age, 5ft. Sin. or 9in. high, slight build, thin features, black hair, shaved except small black moustache, slightly bow-legged; generally wears a black suit, and hard black-felt hat; is likely to be working among horses. He was at Feilding in February last.

Waikaia. — William Braithwaite is charged on warrant with disobeying an order of the Court to pay 3s. 6d. per week towards the support of his illegitimate child by Mary Ann Rowley. Description: A native of New Zealand, a labourer, twenty-two years of age, about 5ft. 9in. high, medium build, pale sallow complexion, very small fair moustache only, fair hair, left eye blue, has lost the right eye; wore a dark-brown tweed suit and soft drab hat; slovenly appearance, and inclined to be round-shouldered. His mother lives on a small farm between Port Chalmers and Waitati. The sum of £16 is. 6d. was in arrears on the 4th September last.

Christchurch.—William Burgess is charged on warrant of commitment for two months' imprisonment for disobeying an order of Court to pay the sum of £8 5s. towards the maintenance of his illegisimate child. Description: Twenty-eight years of age, 5ft. Sin. high, stout build, sallow complexion, fair hair, small dark side-whiskers and moustache, walks as if one leg was shorter than the other; dressed in a dark suit. Christchurch.—Herbert Thomas is charged on warrant with disobeying an order of Court to pay 7s. 6d. a week towards the support of his illegitimate child by Janet Smith. Prescribing a Close Season for Mullet in Kaipara Harbour.

GLASGOW, Governor.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this ninth day of September, 1895.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

W HEREAS, by "The Sea-fisheries Act, 1894" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, among other things, enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, which shall have general force and effect throughout the colony, or particular force and effect only in any waters or places specified therein:

And whereas certain regulations were made by the Governor in Council on the tenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, under "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884," and "The Fisheries Conservation Act 1884 Amendment Act, 1887":

And whereas it is expedient to revoke regulation number six of the said regulations made by the Governor in Council on the tenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, prescribing a close season for mullet in a part of Kaipara Harbour, and to prescribe a close season for mullet in the whole of Kaipara Harbour:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby revoke regulation number six, made by the said Order in Council of the tenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and in pursuance and exercise of the said powers, and with the like advice and consent, His Excellency the Governor of the colony doth hereby make the following regulations, to have force and effect within the waters hereafter specified in the said regulations :-

REGULATIONS.

1. The period from the first day of December in one year to the thirty-first day of March in the next succeeding year, both days inclusive, is hereby prescribed a close season in respect of the fish of the species of the Mugil known as mullet or kanae, during which close season it shall be unlawful for any person to take any such fish contrary to the provisions of the said Act.

2. These regulations shall have force and effect in all waters, as defined by the said Act, of Kaipara Harbour inside a straight line drawn from the lighthouse on the North Head to Trig. Station No. 7, Okaka, on the South

Head of that harbour.

3. Any person committing a breach of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds nor less than twenty shillings, to be recovered as is by the said Act provided.
