NOTICE.—For instructions as to the manner in which reports are required to be furnished for the compilation of the *Police Gazette*, see *Gazette* No. 1 of this year.

The arrest of offenders described in the *Police Gazette*, or respecting whom crime reports have been forwarded for insertion in the *Gazette*, should be promptly notified by the member of the Force effecting the arrest.

When notifying the arrest of persons charged with larceny, or suspected of larceny, it should be stated whether the property stolen, or any portion of it, has been recovered.

A description of property supposed to be stolen, found in the possession of offenders, for which owners cannot be found, should be furnished for insertion in the *Gazette*.

All communications concerning this *Gazette* should be addressed to the Commissioner of Police, Wellington, and the envelope marked "For *Gazette*." Members of the Force in charge of out-stations will forward them *direct*.

Special Inquiry.

WILLIE WYLIE, *alias* Henry Wilson, is inquired for by the Hastings (Hawke's Bay) police. Description: A quarter-caste Maori, twenty years of age, 5ft. 6½in. high, light copper complexion, black curly hair, dark-brown eyes, long nose. (See *Police Gazette*, 1895, pages 58 and 126.) Left Palmerston North about the 12th ultimo, supposed for Wellington. He is required as a witness for the prosecution in a case of forgery, and it is very important that his whereabouts should be ascertained. If found, the Sergeant of Police, at Hastings, should be at once communicated with by telegraph.

Infanticide.

WELLINGTON.—On the 15th ultimo the dead body of a newly-born male child was found in the Wellington Harbour by a boy named Frederick Onyon. The medical evidence adduced at the inquest showed that the child was born alive, and had not been dead more than forty-eight hours, and the jury returned a verdict of "Wilful murder," against some person or persons unknown. The body had no covering on, and was doubled up in an old dark-brown canvas kit.

Arson.

OPOTKI.—On the morning of the 10th ultimo the Masonic building was destroyed by fire, and at inquest held on the 13th a verdict of incendiarism against some person or persons unknown was returned. The building was valued at about £300.

Offences not Otherwise Described.

ARATAPU (AUCKLAND).—Victoria Montorfano is charged on warrant, issued by the Dargaville Bench, with having, on the 28th May last, obtained £110 by forgery. Description: A French Canadian, thirty-seven years of age, 5ft. 5in. high, dark complexion, masculine appearance, speaks English fairly well; dressed in black. She forged the signature of her husband, Frank Montorfano to a withdrawal notice, and thereby obtained the amount from the Post-Office Savings-Bank at Aratapu. Is supposed to have gone to Auckland.

AUCKLAND.—Jessie Rattray, servant to Charles Jones, Shelly Beach Road, reports that about 10.15 p.m. on the 12th instant she was assaulted by a man, name unknown, who attempted to commit rape on her. Offender is described as between twenty-five and thirty years of age, about 5ft. 10in. high, thin build, dark bushy hair, dark moustache only, prominent white teeth, long soft hands, apparently well educated; wore a dark suit, light-coloured tweed cap, and white shirt showing the cuffs. Complainant thinks she could identify him. No warrant.

WOODVILLE.—Christopher Hoodums is charged on warrant with having, on the 16th ultimo, stolen 16s., money of Francis Buckingham, of Mangatainoko. Description: English, a labourer, twenty-two years of age, 6ft. high, medium build, fair or light-brown hair, fair complexion, blue eyes, thin sharp features, slight fair moustache and sideboards, smart active appearance; generally wears a grey-tweed suit, grey-plaid overcoat, and soft brown hat with small brim. Offender received the money from the Secretary of the Mangatainoko School Committee for and on account of complainant and cleared out with it.

WELLINGTON.—James Willoughby Wilson is charged on warrant with fraud on William George Jones, labourer, on the 28th or 29th June last. Offender is English, a coach-builder and cab-driver, forty-five years of age, 5ft. 5in. high, slight build, dark hair beard whiskers and moustache; dressed, when last seen, in a dark sac-suit and hard black-

felt hat. (See *Police Gazette*, 1894, page 152.) He obtained board and lodging to the value of £2 1s. 4d. by presenting deeds of property, which he falsely stated to be his own.

CHRISTCHURCH.—Richard Kobelt is charged on warrant with the theft, between the 28th April and 28th September, 1895, of various sums, amounting to £35, moneys of the Malvern Road Board. Description: English, a clerk, forty years of age, 5ft. 7in. or 8in. high, medium build, dark complexion, dark hair whiskers beard and moustache cut short; dressed, when last seen in a dark tweed sac-suit, and hard black-felt hat. He was clerk to the Board, and received the moneys, but failed to account for them.

CHRISTCHURCH.—Charles E. Edwards, charged with embezzling moneys of William Breckon, has been arrested by Constable W. J. Simpson, Eltham police, on the information of Chief-Detective A. Henderson, of Christchurch. Remanded to latter city, and sentenced to six months' labour on each of two charges (concurrent).

DUNEDIN.—Amy Bock, *alias* Laing, *alias* Bennett, &c., charged with false pretences on Louisa Greig, has been arrested by Constable E. P. Bird, Waikouaiti police, and sentenced to three months' labour.

DUNEDIN.—John Philip Piercy is charged on warrant with the theft of £15, money of Thomas Kay Sidey, farmer, Caversham, on the 16th ultimo. Description: English, an hotelkeeper, forty-five years of age, about 5ft. 11in. high, medium build, smart upright appearance, black hair turning grey, black moustache and small side-whiskers (may now be clean shaved), sallow complexion; wears spectacles, very polite gentlemanly appearance, generally wears a dark paget-suit and hard black hat. He is licensee of the Grand Hotel, which belongs to complainant, and as such received the money, and appropriated it to his own use. Will no doubt endeavour to leave the colony.

DUNEDIN.—Frederick Thomas Horne is charged on warrant with having, on the 14th August, 1895, embezzled £100, money of the Dunedin Finance, Loan, and Agency Company (Limited). Description: English or Colonial, about thirty-four years of age, rather stout, square build, sallow complexion, dark-brown hair, and short heavy dark moustache only; respectable appearance; generally wears a dark-tweed sac-suit and hard black hat. Offender, who was employed as clerk to the company, received the above amount, and converted it to his own use. His defalcations amount to over £1,000. He was also secretary to the St. Clair Trotting Club, and is pretty well known to racing men. His wife and child reside at Caversham, and he will no doubt endeavour to leave the colony. Arrest important.

Housebreaking, Stealing from the Person, &c.

MANAIA.—Stealing from the dwelling of Rhody Slattery, senior: The suspect's correct name is Thomas Hannan, not Hannerman, and he is identical with Thomas Hannan, described in *Police Gazette*, 1894, page 90. It is thought he may have sent some of the chains to his sisters at Christchurch, or to a Miss Lawry, in the same city.

HASTINGS.—Samuel Ridgeway, clothier, reports that, on the 23rd ultimo, his dwelling was broken into, and the following stolen: Four £1 notes, a sovereign, £1 in silver, one dozen boys' flannelette shirts, with collars, Zealandia brand; three or four pairs of tweed trousers (one pair dark-grey saddle-tweed, size 7, marked 18s. 6d.); one dozen small white Turkish towels, linked by fringe in twos; a suit of men's tweed clothing, size 5, "Zealandia" on tab of coat; three white- and two blue-silk ties; two white shirts with collars, Zealandia brand; two pink and two grey flannels; three pairs of light-grey natural wool drawers; an old comb and brush; and a pair of laced boots, much worn, size 7: total value, about £15. Shirts, flannels, and drawers identifiable by private marks.

PAEROA.—John O'Connell, labourer, Waitekauri, reports stolen from him while drunk, on the 14th ultimo, a silver hunting Waltham watch, No. 2677476; value, £5 10s.

EKETAHUNA.—Henry O'Loughan reports stolen from his clothing during a fire at the Railway Hotel, on the 7th ultimo, a silver Waltham double-cased keyless watch, No. 4165842, "Jerome" written inside back case, top of winder worn and looks like brass, value £4 10s.; and a silver albert guard, long plain and twisted links alternately, value £1 10s.

Derby and Venus tobacco, and between 40lb. and 50lb. of Gilmore Younghusband's brands of tea, in 1lb. and ½lb. packages; total value, £6 16s.

AUCKLAND.—Thomas G. Petty is charged on warrant of commitment to the Auckland Gaol for six months in default of paying £8 12s. towards the maintenance of his two children. Description: Colonial, a labourer, thirty-eight years of age, slight build, fair complexion, light-brown hair, blue eyes.

PAEROA.—William Dixon is charged on warrant with failing to provide for the maintenance of his illegitimate child by Hannah Pennell. Description: Colonial, a jockey, about twenty-three years of age, about 5ft. 6in. high, slight build, fresh complexion, brown hair and moustache only, grey or light-blue eyes, smart appearance; usually wears a dark suit and black hard-felt hat. Was seen in Auckland on the 23rd August last. His brother works for the Hon. J. D. Ormond, at Hastings.

NAPIER.—George Bristowe is charged on warrant for failing to provide for the future maintenance of his unborn illegitimate child by Margaret Doel. Description: Colonial, a waiter, thirty years of age, 5ft. 10in. high, slight build, dark complexion, dark hair, clean-shaved except dark moustache trimmed short, generally wears a dark heavy sac-suit, and a brown cap or green-coloured soft-felt hat. His relatives reside in Auckland, and he is well known there and in Wellington as Walter Bentley's advance agent.

NAPIER.—Abraham Hazlett is charged on warrant with disobeying an order of the Court to pay £1 per week for the support of his wife, Emily Hazlett. Description: Supposed English, a butcher, about thirty-three years of age, about 5ft. 10in. high, medium build, dark hair, clean-shaved except dark heavy moustache, generally dressed in a dark sac-coat and vest, light trousers, and hard black felt hat. He was accompanied by a woman about twenty-five years of age, of medium build and height. On the 26th August last he was £11 in arrears.

NAPIER.—Andrew Cavanagh is charged on warrant with disobeying an order of the Court to pay 5s. per week for the support of his mother. Description: A native of Napier, a baker, twenty-nine years of age, 5ft. 8in. high, dark hair, brown eyes, broad shoulders, good appearance, clean shaved except moustache, fond of smiling and showing his teeth; wore a dark-tweed suit. Last heard of at Bulls. He was £3 5s. in arrears on the 5th August last.

Has relatives in Christchurch, Wellington, and Pahiata.

TEMUKA.—Thomas Radford is charged on warrant with neglecting to contribute towards the support of his illegitimate child by Alice Tawdry. Description: A native of New Zealand, twenty-three years of age, 5ft. 8in. or 9in. high, slight build, thin features, black hair, shaved except small black moustache, slightly bow-legged; generally wears a black suit, and hard black-felt hat; is likely to be working among horses. He was at Feilding in February last.

WAIKAIKAI.—William Braithwaite is charged on warrant with disobeying an order of the Court to pay 3s. 6d. per week towards the support of his illegitimate child by Mary Ann Rowley. Description: A native of New Zealand, a labourer, twenty-two years of age, about 5ft. 9in. high, medium build, pale sallow complexion, very small fair moustache only, fair hair, left eye blue, has lost the right eye; wore a dark-brown tweed suit and soft drab hat; slovenly appearance, and inclined to be round-shouldered. His mother lives on a small farm between Port Chalmers and Waitati. The sum of £16 1s. 6d. was in arrears on the 4th September last.

Absconding from Industrial School.

WILLIAM PRICE, Industrial School boy, escaped from the train at Balclutha on the 14th March last. Description: Sixteen and a half years of age, long fair hair, grey eyes,

Regulations under "The Sea-fisheries Act, 1894."

GLASGOW, Governor.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-third day of September, 1895.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Sea-fisheries Act, 1894" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, among other things, enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, which shall have general force and effect throughout the

colony, or particular force and effect only in any waters or places specified therein:

And whereas it is expedient to make the regulations hereinafter set forth with respect to the indigenous fish known as whitebait inhabiting the waters of the colony herein mentioned:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations; and with the like advice and consent doth order that these regulations shall have force and effect in the brackish waters of the Provincial District of Canterbury, and in the whole of the waters of the Waitaki River, and shall supersede all regulations respecting the nets to be used for taking whitebait heretofore in force so far as that provincial district is concerned.

REGULATIONS.

1. No scrim or whitebait-net shall be used as a set-net or be set or placed in openings made in the banks of rivers or streams, or in dams constructed therein, within the Provincial District of Canterbury, or in any of the waters of the Waitaki River, and no scrim hand-net having an opening of more than 9 square feet shall be used for the purpose of catching whitebait.

2. Any person committing a breach of the above regulation shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £1 and not exceeding £20.

3. Nothing in these regulations contained shall be deemed or be construed to affect or interfere with the operation of any regulations for the time being in force under "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884," in relation to the taking or fishing for salmon or trout in the said rivers.

KIAMA.—A warrant has been issued by the Kiama Bench for the arrest of Arnold Montague Gabriel, charged with larceny as a bailee of dentist's instruments, &c., value £20, the property of Leonard Gabriel, of Kiama, on the 15th instant.
