Offences Not Otherwise Described.

AUCKLAND .- Isabella Danzey is charged on warrant with having, on the 3rd instant, forged the signature of the Rev. Walter McDonald to a cheque for £8, drawn on the Union Bank of Australia, and uttered the same to Robert William Gallaugher, grocer, Victoria Street West. Offender is a colonial, about twenty-six years of age, 5ft. 1in. or 2in. high, medium build, peculiar high forehead, fair complexion, and fair hair brushed well back; wore a small black-straw hat, dark-coloured dress, black shoes, and plaid mackintosh with cape.

AUCKLAND .- Julia Wilson is charged on warrant of arrest for keeping a brothel on the 22nd ultimo. Description: A mulatto, forty-five to fifty years of age, 5ft. 4in. or 5in. high, medium build, black hair, dark eyes, thick lips, large mouth, dresses well. She is supposed to have gone to Sydney, but may return to Auckland, where she has property.

It having been observed that, in many instances, members of the force when travelling by rail to attend as witnesses at the Supreme or Districts Courts have neglected to obtain from the Registrars a refund of the costs of the tickets for which requisitions have been issued, the attention of Inspectors in charge of districts is called to the matter, with the

view of their taking the necessary steps to obtain refunds.

This circular will also apply to cases in which requisitions are issued to civilian witnesses attending the above Courts.
