RANFURLY, Governor.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities
vested in me by "The Animals Protection Act, 1880,"
I, Uchter John Mark, Earl of Ranfurly, Governor of the
Colony of New Zealand, do hereby appoint that part of the
said colony described in the Schedule hereto to be a district
under the said "Animals Protection Act, 1880," and I do
further appoint such district to be known by the name of
"The Westland Acclimatisation District."
