Arson.

DUNEDIN. — On the 9th ultimo an unoccupied building at Leith Valley, the property of Robert Rossbotham, and known as the Waterfalls Refreshment-rooms, was destroyed by fire; and at an inquest held on the 26th ultimo a verdict was returned to the effect that the place was wilfully set on fire by some person or persons unknown. The value placed on it by the owner was £100. No insurance.

Description: Colonial, a photographer, thirty years of age, 5 ft. Sin, high, slight build, fair hair, clean-shaved except small fair moustache; usually dresses in light-coloured suit of clothes a well-known cyclist.

Offender may attempt to leave the colony. His wife is now residing with relatives (Calverts) in Dunedin.

WELLINGTON.-W. Haggarty (supposed to be a fictitious name) is charged on warrant with false pretences on the: Customs Department on the 27th July, 1898. Description, Supposed English, thirty six facts of age, 54t. 4 in. high medium build, dark hor print moustacted brill; wore a dark sac-suit, and hard brack tolt blef. He obtained the sum of £2 14s, 9d. by falsely representing mimself as a sailor named William Halligan, to whom the amount was due as wages. Offender is believed to be identical with Henry McMurray.
