## NEW ZEALAND POLICE GAZETTE.

**NOTICE.**—For instructions as to the manner in which reports are required to be furnished for the compilation of the *Police Gazette* see *Gazette* No. 1 of this year.

The arrest of offenders described in the *Police Gazette*, or respecting whom crime reports have been forwarded for insertion in the *Gazette*, should be promptly notified by the member of the Force effecting the arrest.

When notifying the arrest of persons charged with larceny, or suspected of larceny, it should be stated whether the property stolen, or any portion of it, has been recovered.

A description of property supposed to be stolen, found in the possession of offenders, for which owners cannot be found, should be furnished for insertion in the *Gazette*.

### Arson.

**CHRISTCHURCH.**—On the 17th ultimo a dwelling in Gloucester Street, the property of the Church Trustees, was destroyed by fire, which there is every reason to believe was wilfully caused. It was valued at about £450, and insured in the Alliance Office for £300. The furniture belonged to Miss Winifred Gorten, and was insured in the same office for £180, but was valued at £100 more.

**GERALDINE.**—On the 29th September last an attempt was made to destroy the Geraldine Hotel, the property of Mr. Robert Taylor, kerosene having been poured in a corner of a sample-room and ignited; the flames, however, being extinguished before much damage was done. At an inquest held on the 16th instant the jury returned a verdict to the effect that the fire was wilfully and maliciously caused, and with intent to injure Annie Gertrude McLean, the tenant. The jury, in a rider, expressed regret that certain members of the Fire Brigade gave their evidence in a most objectionable manner, and that, instead of assisting the police, they obstructed them in their efforts to bring the offender to justice. Suspicion rests on a member of the Brigade.

### Offences not otherwise Described.

**DEVONPORT (AUCKLAND).**—**Daniel Bogue** is charged on warrant with the theft at Takapuna, on the 19th ultimo, of ten shillings' worth of kauri-gum (recovered), the property of William Brown. Accused is a Colonial, a labourer, about eighteen years of age, about 5 ft. 7 in. high, rather slim build, stoops, slovenly gait, peculiar-shaped nose being thick at the point; dressed in a slop-made dark-tweed suit, dark-felt billycock hat, and heavy boots. A son of John Bogue, late licensee Lake Hotel, Takapuna. He failed to

appear on the 31st ultimo, in answer to a summons, and is supposed to be on one of the gum-fields near Takapuna or the Wade.

**SPIT (NAPIER).**—**Phil. Smith** is charged on warrant with having, between October, 1898, and January, 1899, indecently assaulted Annie Christjansen, a girl under the age of sixteen years. Description: A native of the colony, a labourer, about twenty-five years of age, 5 ft. 6 in. or 7 in. high, stout build, fair complexion, blue eyes, small fair moustache, dark hair, small nose, broad nostrils, full face, round chin, thick lips, large mouth, thick eyebrows meeting close together, discoloured teeth, good-looking; dressed when last seen in a blue-serge coat and vest, grey trousers, and soft light-coloured felt hat. Offender went south in January last, in company with one William Miles. Inquiry is requested at all freezing-works in the colony, as it is considered very probable that he will seek employment at some of them. His friends or relatives are said to reside near Cheviot, Christchurch District.

**DANNEVIRKE.**—**James Swan** is charged on warrant with the theft, on the 5th ultimo, of a cheque for £3, the property of Sergeant James Siddells. For offender's description, see "Prisoners discharged from Napier Gaol" in this *Gazette*. He picked up the cheque while confined in the Dannevirke lock-up, and cashed it in Napier after being liberated from gaol.

**PETONE.**—**James Barker** is charged on warrant with having, on the 13th ultimo, obtained £1 9s. 6d. from Eliza Tannahill, domestic servant, by false pretences. *Regulations for Trout-fishing, Auckland Acclimatisation District.*

RANFURLY, Governor.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-third day of October, 1899.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations for all that part of the colony known as "The Auckland Acclimatisation District," as the same is defined in the said regulations, and the waters thereof, except as herein-after mentioned; and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall, as from the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, supersede all regulations at variance therewith.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. LICENSES to fish for trout in all waters within that district or part of the North Island known as "The Auckland Acclimatisation District," which includes the Counties of Rodney, Waitemata, Eden, Manukau, Coromandel, Thames, Ohinemuri, Raglan, Waikato, Waipa, Piako, Rotorua, Kawhia, and Taupo West, may be issued under the hand of the Secretary of the Auckland Acclimatisation Society (hereinafter termed "the said society"), or any one authorised by the said Secretary in that behalf: Provided, however, that all fishing with rod and line, except with artificial fly, is prohibited in the Waimakariri River from its source to its junction with the Waihou or Thames River, and that all fishing is prohibited in the following streams within the County of Rotorua: All the tributaries of the Waikorowhiti, near Rotorua, and the Mangaweri and Mangapikopiko tributaries of the Whirinaki River.

2. For every license to fish for trout in the waters in the Auckland Acclimatisation District, issued to men under the hand of the Secretary of the Auckland Acclimatisation Society, or any one authorised by the said Secretary in that behalf, a fee of one pound will be charged.

3. The Secretary of the said society, or his deputy, may issue licenses for the whole season to women for the sum of five shillings each; and to boys under the age of sixteen years for the whole season for the sum of ten shillings each; and to men, on and after the fifteenth day of January in any

year, and until the fifteenth day of April in the same year, for the sum of twelve shillings and sixpence each.

4. Any holder of a license may fish with one rod and line for trout, and may use a landing-net or gaff to secure any trout caught with such rod and line, in all waters within "The Auckland Acclimatisation District," from the first day of November in any one year to the fifteenth day of April in the year following, both inclusive.

5. No license shall authorise any person other than the person named therein to fish, and that with natural or artificial fly, insect, worm, or fish only.

6. No person shall have in his possession any of the salmonidæ or trout between the eighteenth day of April and the thirty-first day of October, which period is hereby appointed a close season for all such fish: Provided always that this regulation shall not apply to fish caught by the officers of the said society for purposes of acclimatisation.

7. No person shall put, throw, or place, or allow to be put, thrown, or placed, into any river or stream, or at the mouth or entrance of any such river or stream, any dynamite or other explosive substance, or any sawdust or sawmill refuse, or anything of any kind or description whatever poisonous, deleterious, or noxious to fish.

8. No person shall take, fish for, catch, or kill, in any manner whatever, or have in his possession, any salmon, salmon-parr, or smolts, or the ova, young, or fry of any salmon in any stage whatever; and any of the above-named taken by accident or otherwise shall immediately be returned to the water from whence it was taken.

9. No person shall fish for trout without a license; and every person fishing shall, on demand of any ranger, constable, member of the said society, or person producing a license, produce and show to such ranger, member, constable, or person his license, and the contents of his creel or bag, and the bait used by him for taking, catching, or killing such trout.

10. Every trout not exceeding nine inches in length from nose to tip of tail, taken or caught by any person, shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

11. No cross-line fishing, stroke-hauling, or any other unsportsmanlike device shall be used for the purpose of taking, catching, or killing trout; nor shall any of the above-mentioned baits be used with any medicated or chemical preparation whatever.

12. Except as aforesaid, no person shall fish with or use any net or other engine, instrument, or device for taking fish in any river or stream within the district aforesaid, or at the mouth or entrance of any such river or stream.

13. For the purposes of these regulations, the mouth of every such river or stream shall be deemed to include every outlet of the same and the sea-shore between such outlets, and shall extend over a radius of one-quarter of a mile from the point or line where the waters of such river or stream meet those of the sea or of any harbour at low water.

14. No person shall buy, sell, or expose or offer for sale, or shall fish for the purpose of obtaining for sale, any salmon, trout, or any part thereof.

15. The penalty for the breach of any of these regulations shall not be less than forty shillings or more than fifty pounds.

16. If any person shall be convicted of any offence against these regulations the license (if any) held by the offender shall thereupon become void.
