## NEW ZEALAND POLICE GAZETTE.

**NOTICE.**—For instructions as to the manner in which reports are required to be furnished for the compilation of the *Police Gazette* see *Gazette* No. 1 of this year.

The arrest of offenders described in the *Police Gazette*, or respecting whom crime reports have been forwarded for insertion in the *Gazette*, should be promptly notified by the member of the Force effecting the arrest.

When notifying the arrest of persons charged with larceny, or suspected of larceny, it should be stated whether the property stolen, or any portion of it, has been recovered.

A description of property supposed to be stolen, found in the possession of offenders, for which owners cannot be found, should be furnished for insertion in the *Gazette*.

### Arson.

**OHINGAITI.**—About 1.50 a.m. on the 24th ultimo the Commercial Hotel, occupied by Ambrose John Hurn, was set on fire, and damaged to the extent of £3. At an inquest held on the 6th instant the jury returned a verdict that the place had been wilfully set on fire by some person or persons unknown.

### Offences not otherwise Described.

**AUCKLAND.**—On the 5th September last a cheque for £200, purporting to be signed by William Pyle, sen., was presented for payment at the National Bank of New Zealand, and duly cashed. It has, however, since been declared a forgery, the imitation of the signature being good. Suspicion is attached to *L. R. Rishworth*, who was a clerk and assistant ledger-keeper, and in that capacity initialled the cheque, it being supposed that he got some friend to cash it. Suspect is a native of New Zealand, about twenty-one years of age, 5 ft. 10 in. high, medium build, erect gait, throws his head back when walking, dark hair and complexion, clean shaved; usually wears a dark-tweed suit and hard black-felt hat. He left by the s.s. "Mararua" on the 11th of the above month for Sydney, Melbourne, and Adelaide.

**NAPIER.**—William Williams, charged with false pretences on John Charles Mason, has been sentenced to six months' labour, to commence at the expiration of the sentence now being served.

**WANGANUI.**—**Harry Toy** is charged on warrant with having committed perjury in the Stipendiary Magistrate's Court on the 24th ultimo. Description: A native of China, a laundryman, about thirty-six years of age, about 5 ft. 3 in. high, medium build, small dark moustache, round features, short neck, walks quick with short step, wears no pigtail; speaks good English. Supposed to have gone to Wellington on the 31st ultimo.

**DANNEVIRKE.**—James Swan, charged with the theft of a cheque for £3, the property of Sergeant James Siddells: It has been ascertained that offender sailed from Auckland on the 7th instant on the barque "Grace Deering" for New York.

**PALMERSTON NORTH.**—**Richard Walter** is charged on warrant with the theft, on or about the 23rd ultimo, of two new drays, painted blue, broad tires on wheels; also two heavy draught bay horses, one eight years old, named "Prince," the other "Punch," aged four years: value, about £70. Description: English, labourer, about twenty-five years of age, about 5 ft. 11 in. high, thin build, fair hair inclined to be curly, pale complexion, small fair moustache only, very awkward gait. The offender borrowed £35 from Mr. J. R. Montague, auctioneer, Palmerston North, and gave the above drays and horses as security. On the bill falling due it was found that the offender had left the district, and it is supposed that he disposed of the property in the Levin district.

AUCKLAND.—Caroline Basten, Belmont House, Vincent Street, reports stolen from her bedroom, on the 25th ultimo, a ladies' silver Geneva hunting-watch, maker Baume, number unknown; monogram C.S.V.B. engraved on outside case: value, £3.
