The former was serving a sentence of penal servitude for life (commuted from sentence of death) imposed on 7th June, 1939, for wounding with intent to murder. He is regarded as a desperate criminal. The latter was serving a sentence of two years imposed on him on 1st June, 1938, for housebreaking, and he was then declared to be an habitual criminal. He is also regarded as a dangerous man.
