INQUIRIES, ETC., FROM OUTSIDE NEW ZEALAND.



Sydney (Australia).—Warrants have been issued for the arrest of (1) Robert Sidney Jones and (2) William Burney, photographs above) charging them that at East Maitland on the 7th November, 1940, they escaped from H.M. Prison at East Maitland. Description—(1) Age thirty-five, height 5 ft. 11 in., medium build, dark complexion, wavy brown hair, east in left eye, tip of left forefinger missing. (2) Age twenty-four, height 5 ft. 10½ in., thin build, sallow complexion, dark-brown hair, blue-grey eyes, small brown mole on left side of chin. The former was serving a sentence of penal servitude for life (commuted from sentence of death) imposed on 7th June, 1939, for wounding with intent to murder. He is regarded as a desperate criminal. He may have received an injury to his left leg when dropping from the prison wall. The latter was serving a sentence of two years imposed on him on 1st June, 1938, for housebreaking, and he was then declared to be an habitual criminal. He is also regarded as a dangerous man. They are both now said to be in possession of firearms. Their arrest and extradition are desired. (P. 40/1450.)
