Bank-notes Missing.

PALMERSTON NORTH.—At about 11 a.m. on the 5th instant a parcel containing one hundred Reserve Bank of New Zealand £10 notes, Nos. 156401 to 156500, the property of the NEW ZEALAND GOVERNMENT (Post and Telegraph Department), was posted at Wellington addressed to the "Bank of New South Wales, Bulls," but it failed to reach the addressee. The parcel should have travelled by train to either Greatford or Palmerston North and then by mail contractor to Bulls. Urgent inquiries are to be made with a view to tracing the bank-notes, and the numbers supplied to all banks and other places where they are likely to be tendered. Any information obtained regarding the missing notes is to be communicated to the Inspector of Police, Palmerston North.

Motor Registration: Re-licensing of Vehicles for Licensing Year ending 30th June, 1942.

The following copy of a memorandum received from the Registrar of Motor-vehicles is published for general information. It is desired that proceedings be taken against persons observed to be using motor-vehicles on and after 1st June next with the old number-plates (white numerals and border-line on venetian red ground) attached, but in cases where a motorist, having purchased new registration-plates, has a valid reason for not having them affixed on the 1st June to the motor-vehicle to which they belong, discretion should be exercised as to whether a prosecution should necessarily follow, as each case should be judged on its merits.

When it is desired to ascertain from the Motor Registration Office the name and address of the owner of a motor-vehicle bearing the old number-plates, application should be made by memorandum from the Officer in Charge of the District to the Registrar of Motor-vehicles, Wellington.

MOTOR REGISTRATION: RE-LICENSING OF MOTOR-VEHICLES FOR THE YEAR 1941-42.

The re-licensing of motor-vehicles for the ensuing year commenced at all Deputy Registrars' Offices on the 1st instant. All motor-vehicles in use on public highways on and after the 1st June next should have the new year's plates (white numerals and border line on a black ground, the symbol being a diamond), affixed thereto, as an indication that they have been both licensed and insured for the 1941-42 licensing year.

Section 40 of the Statutes Amendment Act, 1940 (No. 18), prescribes that the ensuing licensing year will extend to and terminate on the 30th June, 1942, and that thereafter the licensing year will commence on the 1st July. No changes have been made insofar as the issuance of plates for the year 1941-42 is concerned.

The assistance received from your Department in the past in co-operating with my officers with a view to ensuring that owners of motor-vehicles comply with the re-licensing and insurance requirements, is very much appreciated. I should be glad if you would again circularize the various police-stations asking them to take action against motorists using their motor-vehicles on public highways on and after the 1st June next with the obsolete (white on venetian red) plates attached thereto.

Now, therefore, pursuant to the Public Safety Emergency Regulations 1940, as amended by the Public Safety Emergency Regulations 1940, Amendment No. 1, and the Public Safety Emergency Regulations 1940, Amendment No. 4, I do hereby consent, subject to the conditions hereinafter appearing, to members of any of the said organizations summoning, organizing, conducting, addressing, attending, or inviting any present or past member of any of the said organizations to attend any meeting held or proposed to be held by or for the purposes of any of the said organizations if the meeting is held or proposed to be held, as the case may be, for study of the Bible, prayer, or worship and for no other purpose and if all the following conditions are complied with, namely:—

- That the meeting is held or proposed to be held within a building or in a tent;
- That no public notice of the meeting or proposed meeting is given except such as may be permitted by a constable;
- That the meeting is not commenced or continued or proposed to be commenced or continued if any persons are present thereat other than members or former members of any of the said organizations.

And I do hereby further consent to the payment of moneys to or for the benefit of any of the said organizations for the purposes only of any meeting or proposed meeting of any of the said organizations, if the meeting is held or proposed to be held, as the case may be, for study of the Bible, prayer, or worship, and for no other purpose, and if all the foregoing conditions as to any such meeting or proposed meeting are complied with.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 26th day of
March, 1941.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Public Safety Emergency Regulations 1940, Amendment No. 4.

(2) These regulations shall be read together with and deemed part of the Public Safety Emergency Regulations 1940* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting in Regulation 2A (as enacted by the Public Safety Emergency Regulations 1940, Amendment No. 1), after clause (6) thereof, the following new clauses :—

“(6A) In any case where under the foregoing provisions of this regulation an organization has been declared to be a subversive organization the Attorney-General may, by notice published in the *Gazette*, consent to the carrying-on of such of the activities of the organization as do not have a subversive tendency and as in the opinion of the Attorney-General may be carried on without being injurious to the public safety.

“(6B) Any such consent may be given upon or subject to such conditions as the Attorney-General thinks fit, and may authorize the payment of moneys to or for the benefit of the organization for such purposes as may be specified in the notice.

“(6C) Any such consent may by notice published in the *Gazette* be amended or revoked.

“(6D) No such consent or conditions shall be deemed to be invalid on the ground that any discretionary authority is thereby conferred on or delegated to any person.

“(6E) In any case where any consent is given as aforesaid no person doing any act, or allowing any act to be done, in pursuance of and in accordance with the consent shall be deemed to have committed an offence against this regulation.”
