Licensing Act Emergency Regulations 1942 (No. 2).

Further to my memorandum of 25th August, 1942, published in the New Zealand Police Gazette, 1942, page 698, with a view to assisting in the detection of sly-grog selling regular inspections are to be made of the records kept by the holders of brewers' licenses and wholesale licenses in accordance with the provisions of Regulation 24 of the Licensing Act Emergency Regulations 1942 (No. 2.)

Such inspections are to be made at regular intervals of not less than one week, and where possible should be made by a member of the Force not below the rank of Sergeant. If this duty is properly carried out, it should be possible to obtain reliable information in respect of premises at which liquor is being sold unlawfully. Where there is evidence of the sale of large quantities of liquor to any person not lawfully entitled to sell liquor full but discreet inquiry should be made as to whether such liquor is being purchased for resale in breach of the law.
