AUCKLAND.—4th September last, that he may be located and interviewed regarding an alleged assault causing actual bodily harm to Thomas Smith Walton, **Frank Wereta**, alias **Frank Patrick O'Rourke**, referred to in Police Gazette, 1944, page 681, and Photographs, 1938, page 89. About 2 a.m. on above date complainant, who assists his daughter in managing an apartment-house at 83 Grafton Road, got out of his bed and went to a room occupied by John Raroa, referred to in Police Gazette, 1944, page 532, and Photographs, 1940, page 5. On entering the room he was attacked by some person who struck him about the head, apparently with a jemmy, which was subsequently found, covered with a blood-stained rag, in the room. Complainant is unable to describe his assailant, as the latter apparently removed the bulb from the light-socket in the room. William Frederick Orr, who is referred to in Police Gazette, 1943, page 868, and Photographs, 1937, page 63, and Raroa, stated that they were in the room during the evening of the 3rd September last, and that when they left (before midnight) Wereta and a European were lying on the bed. They also identified a hat which was found in the room as being similar to that worn by Wereta. About two days later the latter is alleged to have told Raroa and Orr that he committed the assault. **No warrant.**

He was seen near complainant's room about the time the offence was committed.
