Arson and Theft

AUCKLAND.—During the night of 19th–20th ultimo, a wool-shed on a farm in Kawakawa Bay Road, Waitawa, the property of Douglas Ryburn, farmer, Clevedon, was completely destroyed by fire. The following contents were also destroyed: A top-dresser; a drill; a pair of grass harrows; a wool press; a two stand Cooper shearing plant with engine and grinders; 1 cwt. of No. 8 fencing-wire; a cross-cut saw; a hay-knife; and a wool-hook; total value, £223 15s. 6d. (shed and contents not insured). The shed also contained twenty-three bales of various types of wool, value £500 15s. 7d., and as no trace of them was found among the remains of the fire it is considered likely that the bales were stolen and removed in a motor-lorry. Thirteen of the bales were branded "D.R." in red, the remainder "D.R." in blue, and the fleeces faintly branded "D.R." The offender or offenders apparently forced an entry to the wool-shed by prising open the rear door, as the staple and hasp-fastener with lock intact were found in a twisted condition among the remains of the fire. The following articles were also missing from the shed: A 4 lb. Kelly axe, value £1; a brown leather well-worn case of folding type with brass stud fastener, value 10s., containing a gentlemen's nickel-plated well-worn open-face pocket watch, "Pocket Ben" in black letters on white dial, Arabic numerals, letters including "G" and "W" scratched on back and on inside back case, value 12s. 6d. Inquiries should be made at wool-appraisal centres, wool buyers and brokers, wool, skin, and hide merchants, &c., and any information obtained which may assist in the investigation is to be communicated to the Superintendent of Police, Auckland.

Body of Child Found

HAMILTON.—On the 3rd instant, the dead body of a new-born male European child was found alongside the railway-line a short distance north of Puketutu Railway-station. The body was naked and in a state of decomposition, and there was a large wound across the front and each side of its neck, together with bruising and abrasions. A post-mortem examination revealed that death had occurred about five days previous to the finding of the body, that it was 20 in. long, 6½ lb. in weight, that it was a full-time child, had breathed, and that the cause of death was shock following the extensive injury to its neck. The umbilical cord was attached, and the condition of it indicated that the child did not receive any medical attention at birth. It is considered likely that the child was born on a train and then thrown to where the body was found. The injury to the body is consistent with it having been caused by a blunt instrument or with the body coming into contact with some blunt object when thrown from a train. The following blood-stained articles were found near the body: A pink locknit slip with opera top and hand-sewn ribbon shoulder-straps, rose design in art silk on front, fit woman about 5 ft. 3½ in.; a pair of dirty white locknit panties, S.W. size,

"Lustre product Super Locknit" on tag, white cotton elastic around waist; a ladies' white cotton lawn handkerchief, 9 in. square with ½ in. pale-blue border and two sets of blue lines, double line of blue chain-stitching inside border; and a roller-towel with New Zealand Railways brand thereon. Inquiries should be made in all districts where trains passing through Puketutu between about 26th ultimo and 1st instant would stop, also from railway employees, and from doctors, and at hospitals and nursing-homes, and any information obtained which may assist in the investigation is to be communicated to the Inspector of Police, Hamilton.

THE RIGHT HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Evidence Emergency Regulations 1941, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Evidence Emergency Regulations 1941* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding to the definition of the term "oath" the words "and also includes, as well as evidentiary oaths, any promissory oath, including, in particular, any oath of allegiance (whether required for the purposes of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens (in New Zealand) Act, 1928†, or of any other enactment or for any other purpose)".

3. Every oath sworn before the commencement of these regulations shall be deemed to be and to have always been as valid and effectual as if these regulations had been in force when it was sworn.
