Control and Prevention of Forest Fires

The following memorandum has been received from the rector of Forestry. The desired assistance should be Director of Forestry. given whenever requested.

CONTROL AND PREVENTION OF FOREST FIRES

Provisions relative to fire offences in State Forests and Fire Districts are contained in the Forests Act, 1921–22, sections 27 and 44 and the Forest (Fire-prevention) Regulations 1940 (1940/246), as amended (1943/31).

Occasionally fires occur which endanger valuable forests and which in the opinion of local officers can hardly be termed

accidental but are caused through carelessness or deliberate action in defiance of the law. In many cases unfortunately the offenders go undetected owing to the difficulty which

local Forest Officers experience in securing evidence.

If some of these offenders who create a serious menace could be brought before the Court the publicity would undoubtedly act as a strong deterrent to this type of offence and be the means of saving considerable expense in fire-fighting and possibly avertwhat could easily be a national disaster particularly in generate of the extincers to the State.

and possibly avertwhat could easily be a national disaster particularly in respect of the exotic forests, both State-owned and privately owned, in the Rotorua-Taupo District.

I therefore seek your co-operation and assistance in dealing with the matter and suggest that arrangements be made whereby in the event of an outbreak of fire of unknown origin that your local officer would, on request by the Forest Officer in charge of the Fire District or State Forest affected, proceed to the fire as soon as possible after the convergence. proceed to the fire as soon as possible after the occurrence and endeavour to obtain evidence of the cause of the outbreak.

I feel sure that the fact that such fires are subject to police investigation will act as a deterrent and greatly assist in the prevention of fire.

I therefore trust that it may be possible for arrangements to be made accordingly.

THE WARRANT OF FITNESS EMERGENCY ORDER 1944 (NO. 2)

PURSUANT to the Transport Legislation Emergency Regulations 1940,* the Minister of Transport doth hereby make the following Order.

ORDER

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Warrant of Fitness Emergency Order 1944 (No. 2).
- 2. The Warrant of Fitness Emergency Order 1944† is hereby revoked.
- 3. While this Order continues in force clauses (1) and (4) of Regulation 11 of the Traffic Regulations 1936; (as substituted by Regulation 7 of the Traffic Regulations 1936, Amendment No. 1§, and as amended by Regulation 4 (a) of the Traffic Regulations 1936, Amendment No. 3||) shall be suspended, and the following clauses shall be substituted therefor:—
- "(1) Save as provided in clause (4) hereof, no person shall operate a motor-vehicle on a road unless there is carried in the vehicle a warrant of fitness in the form prescribed in the First Schedule hereto issued in respect of that vehicle and disclosing thereon a date of examination not earlier than—
 - "(a) Twelve months before such operation in the case of a trailer or a motor-cycle, or in the case of a motor-car which is correctly insured under Class 4 for the purposes of the Third Schedule to the Motor-vehicles Insurance (Third-party Risks) Regulations 1939¶; and
 - "(b) Six months before such operation in the case of any other motor-vehicle,—

and the driver or person in charge of the vehicle shall produce the warrant for inspection on demand by any police officer or traffic inspector. The warrant of fitness shall be issued only by a city authority or a person or firm appointed or approved for the purpose by the Minister, and such appointment or approval shall be notified in such manner as the Minister directs. With the prior written consent of the Commissioner a warrant of fitness may be issued to a vehicle not equipped with lamps as required by Regulation 7 hereof if such warrant is expressed to be subject to both of the following conditions—namely, first, that no head-lamps shall be fitted to the vehicle, and, secondly, that the vehicle shall not be operated during hours of darkness. The existence of such a warrant shall excuse non-compliance with Regulation 7 hereof, but no person shall, if the only warrant of fitness carried in a motor-vehicle is one containing the conditions herein specified, operate that vehicle on a road in breach of either of those conditions.

"(4) This regulation shall not apply to any vehicle for which there is in force a certificate of fitness issued under the Transport Licensing Act, 1931, or a permit granted under that Act for the vehicle to be used without a certificate of fitness."
