Fancourt or "Bearer," signed "C. M. Rattray" and dated 20/3/45; a cheque for £1 1s., No. 116324, drawn on the Bank of New South Wales, Auckland, in favour of Dean W. Fancourt or "Bearer," signed "p.p. E. H. Binney-M. E. G. Binney," and dated 21/3/45; total value, £186 16s. 8d. Identifiable except moncy.
