Spratt" and "73466" engraved on band on one side, button for releasing film missing, fitted with folding view-finder; a carpet, 12 ft. by 9 ft., with dark and light green mottled centre and dark-green border about 12 in. wide, pink and black floral design in corners; a fawn carpet, 9 ft. by 6 ft., with square and coloured floral designs; a gentlemen's gold Roamer wristlet watch, about 1 in. square, luminous dial and Arabic numerals, seconds hand missing, gold expanding wrist-band made up of narrow links about ¼ in. long, set crosswise, spring in centre near clip-fastener; an oval wall mirror, about 24 in. long and 15 in. wide, bevelled edge, nickel-plated chain attached to two hooks on back; a wall mirror with shaped corners, about 27 in. by 18 in., wooden back with nickel-plated chain on two hooks; a dark-brown stained oak sideboard drawer, 16 in. by 15½ in., by 6½ in., chromium-plated and mottled-brown handle in centre; an electric heater, probably Speedee make, in green cast-iron frame, curved chromium-plated adjustable reflector, one horizontal element; a navy-blue fibre suitcase, about 24 in. by 18 in. by 8 in. with leather corners, two straps; a ladies' 18 ct. gold dress ring set alternately with four diamond chips and three claw-set sapphires in straight setting, but one chip is now missing; an electric iron, probably Hotpoint make, green wooden handle; a chromium-plated Speedee electric jug with black base and wooden handle, about quart size; a black Waterman's Ideal lever-filling fountain-pen with gold band, pocket-clip, and nib; an electro-plated heavy cigarette-case, about 5 in. by 2½ in., holds about fifteen cigarettes; a black pliable rubber two-cell electric torch, American make, perspex reflector; two gold dress-studs; a pair of gold cuff-links, about ½ in. square, covered with black satin; a black lever-filling fountain-pen, Conway Stewart or Waterman make, with pocket-clip, gold band, and nib; a Gillette razor and box for blades in silver case about 3 in. by 1½ in.; a pair of white cotton double sheets with linen finish; six each of fish-knives and fish-forks, Walker and Hall make, in grey cardboard box with dark-blue cloth lining; six each of E.P.N.S. A.1 cake-forks and teaspoons, in black leatherette case; six E.P.N.S. A.1 cake-forks in mottled-green leatherette case; six E.P.N.S. A.1 cake-forks in green composition cardboard case; six each of table and bread and butter knives, Sheffield make, white bone handles, straight blades; six bread and butter knives, white bone handles, straight blades; six each of E.P.N.S. A.1 table and dessert forks; six each of E.P.N.S. A.1 soup, dessert, and sweet spoons; a butter-knife; an E.P.N.S. A.1 jam-spoon; a carving-knife; two sets of E.P.N.S. A.1 salad servers; a silver or E.P.N.S. A.1 cake trowel; a set of pink china salad servers with raised floral design thereon; and a set of black china salad servers with pink, green, and gold-coloured floral design thereon; total value, £167 ls. Mostly identifiable. A finger-impression (probably right thumb) found in the dwelling has been preserved.
