PERSONS WANTED

AUCKLAND.—13th November last, for assault and robbery, **Man** (name unknown). At about 1.5 a.m. on above date Albert Hong Duk, who is partially crippled, alighted from his motor-car outside his home at 219 Hobson Street, and while removing a part of the mechanism from the distributor, he was attacked by an unknown man, who robbed him of the following described property: A black leather wallet, 3½ in. by 2 in., three compartments; a motor driver's license in complainant's name, issued by the Auckland City Council in June last; an Auckland Automobile Association card in complainant's name, issued on 1st September last; an Alien Registration certificate in complainant's name, No. 2461, issued at Auckland on 7th September, 1939; about £15 in wages stamps of various denominations; a warrant of fitness for motor-car, registration-plates No. 118-189, issued by Cadman's Garage, Auckland, on 17th May last; a 14 ct. gold dress watch, about 1½ in. in diameter, white dial, gold Arabic numerals, gold seconds-hand; a 9 ct. gold chain of fetter and two ovals type, about 12 in. long, swivel at one end with about 4 in. of metal chain, a cigar-cutter, a nail-clipper, two small keys, and a corkscrew attached thereto; and £366 in money made up of £5, £1, and 10s. notes; total value, £393 12s. Identifiable except money and stamps. **No warrant.**

AUCKLAND.—About 25th November last, for alleged theft of £9 10s. in money, the property of Eldon Clunie Drake, Falls Road, Waerenga, **Ray Purves**, age about thirty-two, height about 5 ft. 8 in., thin build, dark complexion, black hair, brown eyes, no lower teeth, rising sun above "N.Z." and a number which may be "391722" on one arm; wearing a fawn overcoat with herringbone pattern, brown sports coat, blue-grey trousers, and a grey hand-knitted pullover. On 18th November last, complainant met offender on the Auckland-Wellington express and invited him to his home. Offender arrived at complainant's home on the 22nd and stayed until the 27th November last. He informed complainant that he was an engineer on an American ship berthed at Auckland and that he was able to supply him with a small refrigerator from the ship for £9 10s. Complainant paid Purves the money, but he has not received the refrigerator. He may be identical with **Raymond George Purves**, referred to in Police Gazette, 1944, page 529. **No warrant.** (See following paragraph.)

WELLINGTON.—30th December last, for a breach of his probation (Offenders Probation Act, 1920), **Raymond George Purves**, referred to in Police Gazette, 1944, page 529, and preceding paragraph. He has failed to report to a Probation Officer, and his arrest is desired.

WHAKATANE.—7th instant, that he be located and interviewed regarding his ability to maintain his five children in the care of the Education Department, **Laurie Rossiter**, alias **Bennett**, referred to in Police Gazette, 1944, page 874.

PATUTAHU.—18th ultimo, for theft of a horse, saddle, and bridle (recovered), value £25 10s., the property of Alfred Ernest Stevens, **J. Battie**, age about thirty, height about 5 ft. 8 in., blacksmith, native of New Zealand, slight build, dark complexion, scratch on nose. On above date the horse, saddle, and bridle were stolen from Wairoa Road, and were subsequently recovered at Mahurangi Station, Wairoa, where they had been sold for £13 on the 19th ultimo by the man described. He may be identical with **John Beattie**, referred to in Police Gazette, 1944, page 287, and Photographs, 1931, page 55. **No warrant.**

NATIONAL PARK.—For escaping from the Mental Hospital, The Chateau, on 24th ultimo, **Isobel Lucy Bryant**, age fifty-four (looks younger), height 4 ft. 11 in., widow, native of New Zealand, medium build, fresh complexion, dark hair turning grey, brown eyes, artificial teeth; wearing a green cotton frock with floral pattern, light-coloured stockings, and red slippers (no hat), quick gait.

NAPIER.—22nd December, 1943, for alleged false pretences, **Roy O'Shea**, age about sixty, height about 5 ft. 5½ in., chef, native of New Zealand, medium build, dark complexion, grey hair, impediment in speech; wearing a green sports coat, grey sports trousers, and green hat. On above date he obtained £50 in money from Annie Davidson, Riverbend Road, with whom he was employed at the Central Hotel, by representing that he owned a house property in Wellington, and that he required the money to pay off a mortgage to enable him to sell the property. He left Napier on 10th March, 1944, and inquiries reveal that there is no record of his having owned property in Wellington. The photograph of **Ronald O'Shea**, alias **Robert Ruff**, referred to in Police Gazette, 1938, page 573, and Photographs, 1926, page 39, has been identified as that of offender. **No warrant.**

Arrested, 18/4/45

WELLINGTON.—1st instant, that he be located and interviewed regarding the publishing of obscene matter, **Rex Lane** or **R. Lane**, age about thirty, height about 5 ft. 6 in., seaman and storeman-packer, native of Australia, dark-brown hair, long features, right hip apparently deformed, lame; wearing uniform of Merchant Navy. Notes of an obscene nature were found in tins of caustic soda purchased by W. McLeod, Oamaru, and B. Sandielands, Feilding. The soda was packed by R. H. Armstrong and Co. (N.Z.), Ltd., Thorndon Quay, and inquiries reveal that Lane was employed by that firm between the 6th May last and 6th August, and that his handwriting is similar to that found on the notes. On 8th August last he left this Dominion as a member of the crew of the ship "Ruahine," and was paid off at Liverpool (England) on 30th October last. **No warrant.**

WELLINGTON.—21st December last, on **warrant** of commitment to Wellington Prison for one month in default of paying £12 11s. 6d. arrears on a maintenance order for the support of his child, **Eric Hendes**, alias **Eric George Hondas**, referred to in Police Gazette, 1944, page 518. He left the Dominion on 29th June last as a member of the crew of the ship "Highland Princess."

WELLINGTON.—15th November last, on **warrant** for failing to report for service with the Armed Forces when notified so to do, **Michael John Kelly**, age twenty-three, height 5 ft. 8½ in., seaman, native of New Zealand, thin build, ruddy complexion, fair hair. *Arrested, 2/5/45.*

WELLINGTON.—26th ultimo, on **warrant** for deserting from the ship "Rimutaka," **Joseph McCormack**, age eighteen, height 5 ft. 8 in., assistant steward, native of England, strong build. *Arrested 21/2/45.*

PROPERTY STOLEN

AUCKLAND.—**CONSTANCE MAY MACKAY**, dwelling broken into (see Police Gazette, 1945, page 96): The following described property was also stolen: A two-piece double-breasted dark-grey worsted sports suit with narrow pin stripes, fit man about 5 ft. 11 in., of medium build, name of English tailor on coat; a dark-green canvas suit-case, about 18 in. square, green leather on corners; twenty-eight ladies' white Swiss embroidered handkerchiefs; twelve ladies' white handkerchiefs; a gold (probably 9 ct.) brooch in shape of dagger, about 3 in. long, large opal surrounded by pearls set in hilt, small pearls set near point; a nickel-plated Gem razor, in nickel-plated box about 5 in. by 3 in., with black and green enamel pattern on lid, lined with purple velvet; a pair of silver screw-on drop antique ear-rings, about 1½ in. long, set with semi-precious stones, purchased in Sweden, value £30; a travelling clock in dark-green leather case, about 3½ in. square, green dial; and a nickel-plated bedroom clock, 6 in. square, probably cream-coloured dial, black hands, convex glass with crescent-shaped piece missing near bottom; total value, £66 5s. Portion identifiable.

AUCKLAND.—On the 2nd or 3rd November last, the countinghouse of **SNEDDENS LTD.**, 161 Karangahape Road, was broken into, the safe opened by means of explosives, and the following stolen: £8 10s. in money. Not identifiable. Frocks, which were used to deaden the sound of the explosion, and the safe were damaged to the extent of £105. Finger-impressions found on a cash-box which had been forced open have been preserved.

Identification doubtful.

AUCKLAND.—20th or 21st December last, from a hut at Waikaraka Park, the property of the **NEW ZEALAND GOVERNMENT** (Public Works Department), a filter grease-gun; an Alemite grease-gun; two tappet wrenches, each No. 1A 1442; a tappet wrench, No. 5B 785; a tappet wrench, No. 1B 8993; a pinch-bar; a pair of side-cutting pliers; a pressure-feed oil-can; a screwdriver; and an ORB six-lever padlock; total value, £7 16s. 3d. Portion identifiable. The hut from which the tools were stolen, and an adjoining hut, were completely destroyed by fire. The lock described had been stolen from the door of the first-mentioned hut. A forty-four-gallon drum which prior to the fire contained six gallons of petrol had not exploded, and it is considered likely that the offender or offenders when stealing the petrol struck a match which caused the fire. The huts were valued at £333 each and the contents £22 9s.

Portion identifiable.

AUCKLAND.—30th January last, from the dwelling of JULIA MARY HUME, 17 Kipling Avenue, Epsom, a gold bangle, Nellie Stewart type; and £1 10s. in money; total value, £11 10s. Bangle identifiable. The offence may have been committed by a Man (name unknown), age about twenty, height about 5 ft. 7 in., good build, fresh complexion, wavy fair hair, well spoken; neatly dressed; wearing a fawn sports coat with trousers to match or green or air-force-blue sports coat with grey trousers, who is believed to have committed other similar offences in the city.

AUCKLAND.—6th February last, from a cubicle in the Olympic Swimming Pool, Newmarket, the property of GREY DURANT HUDSON, 12A Cintra Flats, Whittaker Place, a gentlemen's stainless-steel oblong Hermes wristlet watch, No. 4470, Arabic numerals, brown pigskin leather wrist-strap; value, £5. Identifiable.

Portion identifiable.

AUCKLAND.—16th or 17th January last, from a boat-shed in Ngapipi Road, Orakei, the property of ALBERT CHARLES GRIFFITHS, 12 Paritai Drive, Orakei, a 9 ft. clinker-built cedar dinghy, varnished inside and outside with white bottom, rear, centre, and front seats, white rubber hose bumper around top, two varnished oars with white blades, and rowlocks; value, £48. Identifiable.

Portion identifiable. **Paraniri Dardanelles**, referred to in Police Gazette, 1945, page 14, and Photographs, 1938, page 11, and **George Ahitahi Duncan**, referred to in Police Gazette, 1945, page 131, and Photographs, 1937, page 20, who were in possession of a large number of dollars shortly after the offence was committed have been interviewed, but no evidence resulted.

NEWMARKET.—Between the 15th December last and 1st ultimo, from Schofield's Ltd. garage, Broadway, the property of EVELYN CHARLES WILLIAM SEELEY, 4 Rangiatea Road, Epsom, a .22 calibre single-shot rifle, No. 173575, German make, "Alfa Karabiner" on it; value, £3. Identifiable.

Identifiable.

HAMILTON.—13th January last, from the dwelling of JAMES ALEXANDER HORNE, 386 Victoria Street, a Swan fountain-pen with "J.H." on it; three packets of cigarettes; and three letters; total value, £2 2s. 3d. Pen identifiable. Three other similar offences were committed about the same time. These offences may have been committed by Man (name unknown), referred to in Police Gazette, 1945, page 178, as having been seen near the dwelling of EDGAR ARTHUR SMITH on 3rd January last.

TE AWAMUTU.—5th ultimo, from the platform on the railway-station, the property of HAZEL EMPSON, Luffness Private Hospital, a large fibre-cane suit-case containing five travelling rugs; nine sheets, three-quarter size; nine pillow-slips; six bath towels; two tablecloths; five tea towels; six knives; a fruit knife; a vegetable knife; a butter knife; a bread knife; a carving knife; six dessert spoons; six teaspoons; four dessert forks; three dinner forks; six dinner plates; four bread and butter plates; a linen apron; and a tea-cosy; total value, £60 18s. Suit-case and rugs identifiable.

WANGANUI.—12th ultimo, from the dwelling of MEHER DIN AKHTAR, Huia Street, Taumarunui, a brown leather suit-case, about 27 in. by 15 in. by 7 in., "Globe" on inside lid; a three-piece dark-brown suit with "Brown, tailor, Taumarunui" on tag at neck; a black suit, silk lining with stripes, small moth-hole in one thigh, made in India; a gentlemen's silver open-face Railway Lever pocket watch with screw-on front and back, Roman numerals; a gold watch-chain with gold leaf-shaped locket attached; a white cotton shirt with collar, size 6; a cream-coloured silk shirt, size 6; a gentlemen's silver wristlet watch, black dial, luminous numerals, leather wrist-strap; a black fountain-pen; a gentlemen's cotton singlet; a pair of cotton long underpants; some photographs and sundry papers, some of which are written in Indian characters; and £358 14s. in money, made up of one £10, sixty-four £5, and some £1 Reserve Bank notes, and silver; total value, £418. Identifiable except money. The offence may have been committed by (1) **George Leonard Michaelick**, referred to in Police Gazette, 1945, page 15, and Photographs, 1932, page 12. (2) **Anthony Bradford**, referred to in Police Gazette, 1944, page 606, and Photographs, 1940, page 21. They have been interviewed when Bradford stated that Michaelick suggested to him that they should steal complainant's money, but Michaelick denied the allegation.

FELDLING.—During January or February, 1942, from the armoury at Ohakea Aerodrome, the property of the ESTATE OF THE LATE HON. JOHN GEORGE COBBE, a .32 calibre Sauer and Sohn automatic pistol, No. 56664; value, £3. Identifiable.

PALMERSTON NORTH.—17th ultimo, from the lounge of the Cafe de Paris Hotel, the property of ELIZA JANE FRASER, Annidale Station, Tinui, a blue fibre round hat-box, two fasteners one of which was broken, containing a frock with blue and white spots; a navy-blue overcoat; a pair of green and a pair of black slippers, size 7; $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. of Roma tea; a small green comb; two singlets; three pairs of stockings; and a blue-grey necklace: total value, £8 16s. 6d. The offence may have been committed by Alexander Alfred Frederick Douglas, referred to in Police Gazette, 1943, page 564, John Reuben Samuel Shepherd, referred to in Police Gazette, 1945, page 152, and Photographs, 1936, page 59, Flora Worling, referred to in Police Gazette, 1941, page 853, and George Leonard Michaelick, referred to in Police Gazette, 1945, page 193, and Photographs, 1932, page 12. They were in the lounge about the time the offence was committed. Douglas and Michaelick have been interviewed, but no evidence resulted.

LEVIN.—Between the 22nd December last and 5th January, from a mess room, R.N.Z.A.F.
