When notifying the arrest of persons charged with larceny, or suspected of larceny, it should be stated whether the property stolen, or any portion of it, has been recovered.

A description of property supposed to be stolen, found in the possession of offenders, for which owners cannot be found, should be furnished for insertion in the *Gazette*.

### Escaped Lunatic.

**CHARLES GILBERTSON**, who escaped from the Porirua Asylum, returned to his relatives at Wanganui, and has been allowed to remain with them.

### Offences not otherwise Described.

**AUCKLAND.**—**John Frere**, *alias* **John Norman Jones**, is charged with false pretences on the Union Bank of Australia (Limited), on the 7th March, 1899. Description: Supposed Irish, about forty years of age, about 6 ft. high, slight build, fair complexion, thin features, reddish-yellow hair, moustache and small side whiskers, chin shaved, chronic sore eyes, wears glasses; was usually dressed in a blue-serge sac-suit, and hard black hat; horsey appearance. Rented a small farm near Okoia, Wanganui district, in 1898. Offender, whose proper name is John Frere, presented a letter of credit for £260, drawn in favour of John H. Jones by the Bank of Ireland, Kilkenny, and addressed to the Manager of the Union Bank of Australia (Limited), Auckland. He represented that he was the person named in the letter of credit, and obtained the amount on the above date. It was afterwards discovered that a Mr. John H. Jones, a settler in the Wanganui district, was the owner of the letter of credit, and it is not known by what means offender obtained possession of it. Warrant issued on the 27th January, 1900.

**AUCKLAND.**—**J. W. Irvin**, Jervois Road, Ponsonby, reports that on the 3rd ultimo a man, who gave his name as **Robinson**, hired from him a bicycle for a week, and as it has not been returned it is now alleged to have been stolen. **Robinson** is described as an Australian, nineteen or twenty years of age, about 5 ft. 8 in. high, fair hair and complexion, clean-shaved, pimply face, very talkative; dressed in a dark-chocolate suit, skull-cap, and cycling-shoes. The bicycle is a **Jewel**, No. 345 on the ball-head and up-tube on chain, B.S.A. parts, path racing-tires,  $\frac{1}{2}$  in. pitch chain, 84 gear, no mud-guards, ram's horn handles, painted azure blue except a black rim in the back wheel; value, £15. **Robinson** said he wanted it to race a man named **Shaw** at the Thames.

**LEVIN.**—**John Dick Poppleton** is charged on two warrants of commitment to the Terrace (Wellington) Gaol, one for seven days in default of paying £1 9s., fine and costs, for assault, and the other for fourteen days in default of paying £2 8s., fine and costs for using insulting language. Description: Colonial, a groom, twenty-four years of age, 5 ft. 11 in. high, medium build, fresh complexion, brown hair, blue eyes, clean-shaved; usually wears a tweed sac-suit, and grey cap. Supposed to have gone to Wellington. Warrants issued on the 15th ultimo.

**LEVIN.**—**John McCartney** (also known as "Happy Jack") is charged on warrant of commitment to the Terrace (Wellington) Gaol for twenty-one days' imprisonment in default of paying £3 4s., fine and costs, for committing a breach of the peace. (For description see *Police Gazette*, 1900, page 14.) Supposed to have gone to Wanganui *via* Foxton. He was summoned to answer the charge on the 22nd December last, but failed to appear.

**FEATHERSTON.**—**John Crombie** is charged with having on the 28th ultimo, forged and uttered a cheque for £8 to **James Cress**, hotelkeeper, Tauherenikau. Offender's description agrees with that of **Archibald John McNeil**, *alias* **Crombie**, *alias* **Palmer**. (See *Police Gazette*, 1899, page 122, "Prisoners Discharged from Invercargill Gaol.") Dressed in a dark suit and soft brown or dark-felt hat; has the appearance of a jockey or speler. He was seen at the Pahiatua Races on the 1st instant. The cheque is drawn on the Bank of New Zealand, Featherston, and purports to be signed by **E. Tullock**, but has been declared a forgery. Warrant issued on 1st instant.

**WELLINGTON.**—**Alfred E. Horsefield** is charged on warrant with the theft of £1 5s., money of his employer, **Alfred Josiah Powley**, dairyman, between the 20th and 28th

ultimo. Description: A native of New Zealand, a driver, about twenty-one years of age, about 5 ft. 9 in. high, medium build, dark hair and complexion, no hair on face; dressed in a dark-blue sac-suit, soft brown-felt hat, and tan shoes. He received the amount in small sums from customers, and converted it to his own use.

WELLINGTON.—**Frederick Lewison, alias Frederick Charles Kingan, alias George, alias James Stephenson**, is charged on warrant of commitment to the Terrace (Wellington) Gaol for forty-eight hours' imprisonment in default of paying 18s., fine and costs, for driving a vehicle at other than a walking pace. Description: A native of New Zealand, a painter and jockey, twenty-five years of age, 5 ft. 9½ in. high, fair complexion, brown hair, grey eyes, small nose, scar on forehead. ### Housebreaking, Stealing from the Person, &c.

THAMES.—Mrs. Horatio Phillips reports that between the 20th December last and the 3rd instant her dwelling was broken into, and the following stolen: A large barometer, about 2 ft. long, woodwork very dark, steel indicator, brass plate at top for hanging to the wall missing; a silver-plated cruet, one of the bottles cracked, pepper-box has a rivet through top; a pair of mother of pearl opera glasses with monogram "G.C.P.;" a silver serviette-ring, engraved "G.C.P.;" a small sized electro-plated square alarm-clock, handle on back loose; a large-sized clock, tower pattern, thermometer set in below dial; ten silver egg-spoons, image of an apostle on top of the handle of each, a silver-plated biscuit jar, and a jewellers' brush, small size: total value, £17.

*Regulations for Netting Trout in the Lakes in the South Canterbury Acclimatisation District.*

RANFURLY, Governor.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-third day of January, 1900.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations for the purposes of the said Act; and doth hereby declare that such regulations shall have effect within that part of the Provincial District of Canterbury comprising the Counties of Geraldine and Levels, and that portion of the County of Mackenzie lying to the east of a line commencing at Mount Cook, and proceeding by a right line over the Ball Hut to the Tasman Glacier; thence along the western boundary of the Tasman Glacier to the Tasman River; thence by a line along the middle of that river, and the middle of Lake Pukaki, and the middle of the Pukaki River, to the Waitaki River; together with the Borough of Timaru.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. UNTIL otherwise ordered by His Excellency the Governor, the South Canterbury Acclimatisation Society (hereinafter termed "the said society") shall have the control and management of all salmon and trout now in or hereafter to be placed in the lakes in the district to which these regulations relate, and for this purpose may divide the lakes in the said district into suitable areas; the right of netting such areas to be let by the said society from year to year, or, at the option of the said society, for any term not exceeding three years, in such manner as the said society shall think fit.

2. The season for netting trout shall extend from the 1st day of October in any year to the 15th day of April in the year following: Provided that in letting any right of netting the said society shall have power to restrict the season for such netting.

3. No nets of a smaller mesh than four inches in diameter (when the net is wetted) shall be used in any portion of the said district for the taking of trout, and all trout taken weighing less than three pounds shall be forthwith returned to the water from whence taken.

4. No net for the taking of fish of any kind or description whatever shall be used or set or placed in any of the rivers, or streams, or creeks within the said district, or within one

mile of the mouth of any river, stream, or creek within the said district.

5. No person shall be permitted to use a net for the purpose of fishing in any of the lakes aforesaid unless he holds a valid license so to do from the secretary of the said society. Any person holding a license to fish for trout, perch, or tench with rod and line only, under the hand of the secretary of the said society, may fish with rod and line in any of the aforesaid lakes, anything contained in these regulations notwithstanding.

6. Notwithstanding anything contained in the regulations for the time being in force for fishing for trout, perch, or tench with rod and line, it shall be lawful for every person duly licensed to net trout to sell any trout which he may have lawfully netted, and it shall be lawful for persons to purchase such trout. The said society may also issue licenses to persons (others than the holders of licenses to net) to sell trout lawfully netted: Provided that it shall not be obligatory on the said society to issue a license to any person. In the case of a prosecution against any person for having unlawfully purchased trout, it shall be a sufficient defence if such person can prove that such trout were purchased from any person having a license to sell the same.

7. Licenses to sell lake trout will be issued only on the express condition that the society, by its officers, rangers, inspectors, constables, members of the council, or any other person duly authorised, shall have full power at all reasonable times to enter the shop or premises of any person holding a license, and to request the licensee to produce his books showing all the particulars required by these regulations to be kept and entered; and it shall be a breach of these regulations for the licensee to withhold from any of such persons as aforesaid any material information relative to such particulars which he is able to give, or which such persons may reasonably require, relating to the taking, procuring, or selling of trout.

8. Every holder of a license to sell lake trout shall keep a book wherein shall be entered the true christian and surnames of every person from whom such license-holder shall purchase or procure any lake trout, specifying the number and weight of trout purchased from each person, and the district, and the exact locality in which such trout was or were taken; and, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in these regulations, a penalty of not less than one pound shall be incurred for any breach of this section.

9. No person shall use any dynamite or other explosive substance whatever, or any lime or other noxious material of any kind or description whatever, for the purpose of taking or procuring lake trout.

10. Every person committing a breach of these regulations shall on conviction be liable to a penalty, unless otherwise specially provided, of not less than one pound and not exceeding fifty pounds, and his license or licenses thereupon shall immediately become forfeited, without any compensation whatever.

11. These regulations shall come into force on and from the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.
