Arson.

NAPIER.—On the 2nd instant an attempt was made to burn down the Theatre Royal, Tennyson Street; fire was discovered in two separate places about the same time, and was extinguished; damage to the extent of about £2 was done to the wall. The theatre is owned by Vigor Brown and others, and is said to be insured below its value.

Offences not otherwise Described.

AUCKLAND.—**Emma Agnes Baller** is charged on warrant with the theft, on the 28th ultimo, of four pillowcases, a tablecloth, a curtain, a sheet, and sundry articles; total value, £2. Description: A native of New South Wales, twenty-nine years of age, 5 ft. 4 in. high, medium build, fair hair, fair complexion, rosy cheeks, blue eyes; dressed in black skirt, green check blouse, white hat, and white boots; a married woman, but has recently been living in brothels. The above articles were held by George Patterson under a bill of sale, and were removed by offender.

AUCKLAND.—**John Frere, alias John Norman Jones**, is charged with false pretences on the Union Bank of Australia (Limited), on the 7th March, 1899. Description: Supposed Irish, about forty years of age, about 6 ft. high, slight build, fair complexion, thin features, reddish-yellow hair, moustache and small side-whiskers, chin shaved, chronic sore eyes, wears glasses; was usually dressed in a blue-serge sac-suit, and hard black hat; horsey appearance. Rented a small farm near Okoia, Wanganui district, in 1898. Offender, whose proper name is John Frere, presented a letter of credit for £260, drawn in favour of John H. Jones by the Bank of Ireland, Kilkenny, and addressed to the Manager of the Union Bank of Australia (Limited), Auckland. He represented that he was the person named in the letter of credit, and obtained the amount on the above date. It was afterwards discovered that a Mr. John H. Jones, a settler in the Wanganui district, was the owner of the letter of credit, and it is not known by what means offender obtained possession of it. Warrant issued on the 27th January, 1900. It is now thought he may have left New Zealand, and his arrest is requested in any of the adjacent colonies. A reward of £20 is offered for his arrest and conviction. (00/447.)

AUCKLAND.—**Edwin William Nesbit Holloway** is charged on warrant with the theft of £772 10s., money of the Public Trustee of New Zealand, on the 1st instant. Description: A clerk in the Public Trust Office, supposed native of New Zealand, about twenty-seven years of age, about 5 ft. 11 in. high, medium build, walks very erect, clean shaved except small fair moustache, fair hair, freckled face, a full set of very white false teeth, usually dressed in blue vicuna suit, white straw hat, sometimes wore a brown-tweed suit; he has a bass voice, and is fond of smoking cigarettes. He obtained

a cheque from the Postmaster at Auckland in exchange for a Public Trust cheque, and cashed the former cheque for seventy-seven £10-notes, two £1-notes, and a half-sovereign. Offender was last seen on the Queen Street Wharf, Auckland, on the 5th instant, and may have gone to Sydney, or some of the other colonies. A reward of £50 is offered for his arrest.

AUCKLAND.—**William Fahey** is charged on warrant with having, on the 30th January last, committed rape on Jane Kew, at Parnell. Description: Irish, a barber, about thirty-one years of age, about 5 ft. 3 in. high, fresh, freckled complexion, dark-brown hair, blue eyes, clean-shaved except fair moustache, dressed in dark or light sac suit and dark Dr. Jim hat. (See *Police Gazette*, 1897, page 56; and 1898, page 191.) He administered chloroform, and then committed the offence. He may have with him a large American trunk with oval top, and a black gladstone-bag.

PORT ALBERT.—**Sydney Herbert Hansen**, charged with false pretences on Thomas Partridge, has been arrested by Constable Kelly, Helensville police, for theft, and sentenced to two months in Auckland Gaol.

HAMILTON.—**James Armstrong**, charged with disobeying the terms of his release under "The First Offenders Probation Act, 1886," has been arrested by Constable A. McPhee, Te Awamutu police, and remanded to Hamilton.

MANGAWEKA.—**Joseph Gilford** is charged on warrant of commitment to Wanganui Gaol for three months for using obscene language. Description: Supposed native of New Zealand, a jockey, twenty-two years of age, about 5 ft. 1 in. high, 8 stone weight, dark hair, no hair on face, very slim build, thin features, walks with very short steps, generally wears pepper-and-salt sac suit, very baggy pants, and skull-cap pulled down to the ears; he is fond of drink.

NAPIER.—**Edward Hobman**, charged with the theft of James Barkwith's bicycle, has been arrested by Sergeant Cruickshank, and remanded to Woodville.

NAPIER.—**George Rymer**, livery-stable keeper, reports that on the 4th December last, **Carr Ellis** hired a horse and sulky for two months, stating he was going to canvass for sheep-dip. He was in Napier on the 8th of January last. As no trace can now be got of him, it is believed he has disposed of the horse and trap. Description: Supposed English, about forty-five years of age, about 5 ft. 5 in. high, medium build, dark complexion; hair, beard, whiskers, and moustache dark, slightly mixed with grey; dressed in dark-tweed sac suit and soft black-felt hat. He almost continually smokes a pipe. The horse is about 14½ hands high, a black light-harness mare, branded M on near shoulder, six years old, a large star in forehead, one hind foot white; value £14. The body of sulky is painted brown and the wheels red, value £10; and an ordinary set of buggy-harness, value £4.

CHRISTCHURCH.—**J. Boyd alias Bert Russell** is charged on warrant with having, on the 26th ultimo, forged and uttered to Gavin London a cheque for £5 12s. Description: About twenty-six years of age, about 5 ft. 9 in. high, medium build, dark complexion, dark hair, dark moustache, wore a dark pepper-and-salt sac suit. The cheque is drawn on the Bank of New Zealand, Christchurch, and was signed "R. Heaton Rhodes," but has been declared to be a forgery.

CHRISTCHURCH.—**William Hoggard, alias William P. Hoggard**, is charged on warrant with being an idle and disorderly person. Description: A native of Auckland, a cabinetmaker and cabman, about thirty-one years of age, 5 ft. 8½ in. high, fair complexion, fair curly hair, blue eyes (see *Police Gazette*, 1900, pages 21 and 52). When last seen he was dressed in brown-tweed suit and brown cap.

INVERCARGILL.—**Edward William Thomas**, charged with the theft of Isadore Samuel De Beer's bicycle, has been arrested by Constable P. Joyce, Otautau police, and remanded to Invercargill.

Housebreaking, Stealing from the Person, &c.

FELDING.—**Robert Pearce**, billiard-marker, Denbigh Hotel, reports stolen from his room, on the 28th ultimo, a nearly new worsted sac coat, bound with silk braid, a pair of slate-coloured tweed trousers, "T.R.P." on waistband, and a pair of nearly new tan boots, size 6; total value, £2 10s. Suspicion attached to **Oscar Lundgreen, Thomas O'Brien, and Thomas Miller**. (For description of Lundgreen see *Police Gazette*, 1898, page 221.) O'Brien is supposed identical with **James Darmody, alias John Bowdler** (see *Police Gazette*, 1899, page 23). Miller is twenty-eight years of age, 5 ft. 9 in. high, stout build, fresh complexion, dark moustache only, dressed in blue sac suit and hard hat.

STRATFORD.—**Thomas Nash**, labourer, reports stolen from his tent on the 2nd or 3rd instant two single £1 notes, bank and numbers unknown, a silver long-link chain, a silver maltese cross attached with monogram "T.N." on it; value 15s.

WANGANUI.—**James Henry Flight** reports stolen from his bedroom, in Mrs. Ansley's boarding-house, on the 7th instant, a brown leather pocket-book with three compartments, containing two £1 notes, numbers unknown; a cheque-book on the New Plymouth branch of the Bank of New Zealand; an I O U for £10, signed "P. Mellar"; one for £40, signed "Mrs. Mellar"; a bank-receipt for £100 in the Bank of New Zealand, New Plymouth; and a photo.

WELLINGTON.—**James Smith Cross** reports stolen from him, on the 1st or 2nd instant, a lady's gold chased hunting watch, No. 67679; a 15-carat gold albert, long link pattern, both watch and chain well worn: total value, £7 10s.

CHRISTCHURCH.—**Heinrick Henenberger**, suspected of stealing Alice Whale's watch, has been charged with the offence, and sentenced to one month's imprisonment. The watch has not been recovered.

DUNEDIN.—**William John Harkness**, labourer, reports stolen from his bedroom, on the 13th ultimo, a double-cased silver lever watch, number unknown, maker Molyneaux, London, "W. J. Harkness" engraved on inside of outer case, which is much worn; value £1.

DUNEDIN.—**James Reid** is charged with having on or about the 4th instant stolen from his brother-in-law, **Andis Wékland**, a five-chamber revolver, value £3; a double-cased silver watch, number unknown, "G.M." on centre of outside case, "Major G. S. Mee" on inside of one case; two towels, with red and white stripes: total value, £6 14s. 6d. Description: Native of New Zealand, twenty-one years of age, 5 ft. 5 in. high, fair complexion, grey eyes, brown hair, pug nose, narrow forehead, protruding ears, slight build, fair moustache only; dressed in old brown-tweed coat, blue-serge trousers, red soft-felt hat, lace-up boots; carrying swag, consisting of blue blanket, a patched quilt, and an old tent. Warrant to issue.

Stealing Otherwise than from the Person or from Dwellings.

CAMBRIDGE.—**Maurice Donny**, farmer, Waimai, reports stolen, on the 20th ultimo, a colonial-made gentleman's saddle, well worn, one knee-pad has been repaired on top, a piece of leather, "V" shape, inserted on top of gullet, square stirrup-irons; value, £3 10s.

NAPIER.—**John Martin**, tailor, reports stolen from his shop, on the 20th ultimo, a brownish-coloured tweed sac coat, small indistinct check pattern, has two side-pockets and one inside and one outside pocket, "Martin and Sons," Napier, on the tab; value, £3.

WANGANUI.—**Messrs. Naylor and Spriggen**, totalisator proprietors, report stolen from the totalisator-window at the racecourse, on the 9th instant, £100 in single notes, bank and numbers unknown. The offence was committed by two men, names unknown, one about thirty years of age, about 5 ft. 6 in. high, medium build, fresh complexion, clean shaved, wore a dark-brown suit and a brown Dr. Jim hat, slightly

stooped, appeared to be a jockey or racecourse spieler; the other about thirty years of age, about 5 ft. 4 in. high, sallow complexion, clean-shaved except small dark moustache, slight build, dressed in dark-blue suit, dark soft hat, green tie with yellow stripes; and had the appearance of a jockey or spieler.

WELLINGTON.—Hugh Good, farmer, Pihama, Taranaki, reports stolen from the Manawatu train, on the 14th November last, between Wellington and Hawera, a large brown old Gladstone bag, the bottom broken, containing a dark-blue suit of clothes, a pair of nearly new grey tweed riding breeches, a pair of hog-skin leggings with buttons, a quantity of ties, collars, and kerchiefs, two code books, a private cypher book, two mining reports from J. Gow: value, £11 2s. 6d.; also four bottles of gold specimens; value, £20.

INVERCARGILL.—John Everett, coal merchant, reports stolen, on the 21st or 22nd ultimo, from off his horse, a nearly new canvas horse-cover, branded on near side "H. Cunningham, maker, Invercargill." A private mark like a X has been made in blue ink on the inside breast of cover, on the crupper, and under the back-band; value, 17s. 6d.

Deserting Wives and Families, &c.

AUCKLAND.—Albert Edward Palmer is charged on warrant with disobeying an order of Court for the maintenance of his wife, the sum of £94 being in arrears on the 31st of January last. Description: A native of Auckland, a labourer and cook, twenty-seven years of age, 5 ft. 9½ in. high, medium build, fresh complexion, dark-blue eyes, long straight nose, sometimes clean-shaved, but generally wears beard, whiskers, and moustache; dressed in light-tweed trousers, dark-blue serge coat, and brown-felt hat. He is fond of drink, and frequents hotels, singing and playing the piano. (See *Police Gazette*, 1899, page 45.) In December last he was employed on the co-operative works near Te Rau-a-Moa. He is also known by the name of "Jackson" and "Happy Palmer."

AUCKLAND.—Frank Stanley, charged with disobeying an order of Court to support his mother, has been arrested by Constable D. C. Fraser, and arrears paid.

GISBORNE.—Thomas Neil is charged on warrant with failing to provide for the maintenance of his illegitimate child. Description: A colonial, twenty-five years of age, 5 ft. 7 in. high, stout build, ruddy complexion, round full face, dark eyes, black moustache only, black curly hair, curly fringe on forehead; generally wears a blue-serge sac-suit and white-straw hat. He was last seen in Wellington. Complainant, Isabel Ann Morrell, Gisborne.

Description: A native of New Zealand, a shepherd, twenty-six years of age, about 5 ft. 10 in. high, very slight build, fresh complexion, fair hair, fair moustache only; his parents reside at Alford Forest, near Ashburton. Supposed to have gone to Wellington, and may try to reach one of the other colonies.

CHRISTCHURCH.—Charles Keast is charged on warrant with having deserted his wife since the month of February last. Description: A native of New Zealand, twenty-eight years of age, about 5 ft. 10 in. high, walks very erect, medium build, brown curly hair, small blue eyes, fair complexion, a front tooth broken, thick lips, clean-shaven except small brown moustache, thin nose, usually dressed in navy blue serge trousers, brown faded sac coat, has a dark-coloured overcoat, and black-felt hat. He is supposed to have gone to the bays, Akaroa, grass-seeding. He generally works in a grain store or with a threshing-machine.

CHRISTCHURCH.—Arthur Victor is charged on warrant with failing to maintain his illegitimate child. Description: Supposed colonial, a painter, about twenty-eight years of age, about 5 ft. 7 in. high, medium build, dark complexion, dark hair and eyes, Jewish appearance, slight dark moustache only, one upper tooth projects on left side, usually wears a blue-serge sac suit and a check tweed golf cap.
