### Arson.

**MIDDLEMARCH.**—On the 19th ultimo an outhouse, the property of Patrick Spratt, farmer, Sutton, was wilfully set on fire. Suspicion attached to a man, name unknown, who was seen near the place. Description: About fifty-four years of age, 5 ft. 6 in. or 7 in. high, medium build, grey beard, blood-shot eyes, very round shoulders; dressed in dark coat and vest and dark trousers. Is identical with man suspected of stealing jewellery from Ruth Elizabeth Naylor. (See *Police Gazette*, 1901, page 106.)

**WANGANUI.**—W. T. Shannon is charged on warrant with false pretences on Lucy Honor, barmaid, in January last. Description: About thirty years of age, a canvasser, about 5 ft. 6 in. high, medium build, ruddy complexion, dark-brown moustache only, dark-brown curly hair turning grey; scar, apparently from burn, on side of face; dressed in brown-tweed suit and hard black hat. Offender represented he was travelling for the Wellington Art Studio, enlarging photographs, and obtained 2s. 6d. from complainant. Other charges pending. He was formerly canvassing for vapour-bath machines, and was in Feilding about the 15th ultimo.

**PALMERSTON NORTH.**—Thomas Young, licensee Railway Hotel, reports that, on the 15th ultimo, *George Johnston* (name probably fictitious) obtained £1 from him by means of a valueless cheque drawn by offender on the Bank of New Zealand, Marton. It was returned, marked "No account." Description: About twenty-three years of age, looks like a station-hand, about 5 ft. 9 in. high, slight build, pale complexion, dark hair, moustache only; dressed in dark-tweed coat and vest, grey saddle-tweed trousers, and dark-felt hat. **CHRISTCHURCH.**—John Williams is charged on warrant of commitment to Lyttelton Gaol for three days in default of paying £1 fine and costs for an indecent act. Description: A native of Scotland, a labourer, fifty-four years of age, 5 ft. 11 in. high, medium build, sallow complexion, grey hair and eyes. About 50 lb. kauri-gum; a silver open-faced English lever watch (No. 241), maker, "Morton," stamped on face and "Morton" scratched on inside of case, hair-spring broken, second-hand missing, silver curb-pattern chain attached; a gilt bronze Maltese cross, with rose, shamrock, thistle, and crown on it—the property of Frank Savidan: value, £5 7s. 6d.

Description: A native of Ireland, about forty-eight years of age, about 5 ft. 9 in. high, medium build, sandy complexion, and hair turning grey with a white lock in front, dark sandy whiskers, a very noticeable scar on left cheek, brown eyes, Roman nose, part of mast and woman's head on left arm; dressed in blue-dungaree trousers, dark sac coat, and a soft brown or a coarse-straw hat. Supposed going towards Aohanga.

WAITARA.—William Beaumont, labourer, reports stolen from his hut, on the 25th ultimo, a brown cash-box, containing seven £1 notes on the Banks of Australasia and New Zealand. #### Extending the Close Season for Seals.

RANFURLY, Governor.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this nineteenth day of April, 1901.

Present:

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE R. J. SEDDON PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Sea-fisheries Act, 1894" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, among other things, enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make regulations (which shall have general force and effect throughout the colony, or particular force and effect only in any waters and places specified therein) for prescribing, among other things, a close season for seals, and for extending any close season so prescribed:

And whereas it is further provided by the said Act that every person who, during any close season for seals, takes any seals is liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding five hundred pounds, and in addition thereto is liable to a further penalty, not exceeding twenty pounds, in respect of every seal so taken:

And whereas by Order in Council, dated the twenty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, the months of January, February, March, April, May, and June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, were prescribed a close season for seals:

And whereas by Order in Council, dated the twenty-seventh day of March, one thousand nine hundred, the said close season for seals was extended up to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and one:

And whereas it is desirable to further extend such close season for seals:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto; and with the like advice and consent doth order that such regulations shall have force and effect throughout the Colony of New Zealand, and in all salt, fresh, and brackish waters of the colony, and on all shores of such waters or any part thereof.

### SCHEDULE.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. The close season for seals prescribed by regulations made by Order in Council dated the 21st day of December, 1894, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 1, of the 4th day of January, 1895, and which was, by Order in Council dated the 27th day of March, 1900, extended up to the 30th day of June, 1901, is hereby further extended up to the 30th day of June, 1902.

2. Every person who, during the close season prescribed as aforesaid, takes any seal is liable to a penalty of not less than £25 nor more than £500, and in addition thereto is liable to a further penalty of not less than £1 nor more than £20 in respect of every seal so taken. The taking of seals means and includes the killing, catching, dredging for, raising, or hunting of any seal, or any attempt so to do.

3. No person shall buy, sell, expose for sale, consign for sale, buy for sale, or have in possession any seal, or any skins, oil, or blubber from any seal, in any manner in contravention of the said Act or of these regulations; and every person so doing is liable for every such offence to a penalty of not less than £1 nor more than £20.

*Animals Protection Acts.—Declaring Reserve for Native and Imported Game, St. John's Lake and Area adjacent thereto, County of Eden.*

RANFURLY, Governor.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred upon him by "The Animals Protection Act, 1880," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand doth hereby notify that native and imported game shall not be taken or killed within that portion of the County of Eden, in the Auckland Land District, more particularly described in the Schedule hereto.

### SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north-west generally by Green Lane from the Great South Road to St. John's College and St. Hillier's Bay Road; thence by that road to the road forming the eastern boundary of Allotment No. 37, Section No. 12, Suburbs of Auckland (Parish of Waitemata); thence towards the east by the road forming the eastern boundaries of Allotments Nos. 37, 48, 47, 26A, 26, and 27 to the Auckland-Panmure Road; and thence towards the south by the said Auckland-Panmure Road and the Great South Road to the place of commencement.

*Notice respecting Native and Imported Game.*

Colonial Secretary's Office,  
Wellington, 24th April, 1901.

THE attention of sportsmen, game-dealers, and others is called to the provisions of "The Animals Protection Act Amendment Act, 1889," "The Animals Protection Act Amendment Act, 1895," and "The Animals Protection Acts Amendment Act, 1900," which are now in force. A digest of the chief of such provisions is subjoined, viz. :—

**"THE ANIMALS PROTECTION ACT AMENDMENT ACT, 1889."**

Section 4. No person shall kill, destroy, or shoot at any game or native game with anything but a shoulder-gun, and no such gun must exceed size No. 10 at muzzle, or be fitted with barrels exceeding 36 in. in length. No gun shall exceed 10 lb. in weight.

Any person offending against this provision is liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Section 5. No person shall sell any native game, or take or kill any native game for the purpose of sale, without previously taking out the required license.

Penalty not exceeding £20.

Section 6. No sale of native game shall take place prior to the 1st May and subsequent to the 1st August in any year.

If any person hold a license to sell game—i.e., imported game—he is not liable to pay a second fee on taking out a license to sell native game. But both licenses must be taken out if it is intended to sell both kinds of game.

**"THE ANIMALS PROTECTION ACT AMENDMENT ACT, 1895."**

Section 6. Section 12 of "The Animals Protection Act, 1880," is repealed. No person can now sell game, or dispose thereof for any gain or reward, unless he be the holder of a license to sell such game.

Penalty not exceeding £20.

**"THE ANIMALS PROTECTION ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1900."**

Section 2. Season for taking or killing native and imported game, 1st May to 31st July (except in Provincial District of Otago, where the season is 1st April to 30th June).

Section 3. No game or native game to be exported without the written consent of the Colonial Secretary, nor held in possession for a greater period than seven days after close of season, whether such game or native game be frozen, chilled, or not.

Section 4. Native pigeon, pukeko, and kaka not to be taken or killed this year.
