Escaped Lunatic.

JAMES REA escaped from the Sealiff Asylum on the 20th ultimo. Description: A native of New Zealand, twenty-two years of age, 5 ft. 6 in. high, medium build, fair complexion, dark-brown hair, small fair moustache only; dressed in dark-tweed coat and vest, moleskin trousers, dark-tweed hat, blucher boots, cross branded on clothes; was formerly an industrial-school boy, and committed to asylum at Invercargill on the 18th December, 1889.

Offences not otherwise Described.

AUCKLAND.—**Thomas McCluskey**, *alias* **Cosgrove**, is charged on warrant of commitment to Mount Eden Gaol for seven days in default of paying £1 12s. for committing a breach of the peace. Description: A native of Scotland, a horse-trainer, thirty-five years of age, 5 ft. 3½ in. high, fresh complexion, light-brown hair, grey eyes, small nose, scar on right cheek. NEWTON (AUCKLAND).—Charles Hassett, charged with false pretences on Platt and Hill, has been arrested by Constable P. J. Dunn, Mongonui police, and remanded to Auckland.

WOODVILLE.—**H. E. Adler** is charged on warrant with false pretences on Edwin Gallichan, hotelkeeper, on the 10th May, 1901. Description: A native of Heligoland, speaks with a German accent, a carpenter, has been a sailor, about thirty-seven years of age, about 5 ft. 7 in. high, well built, square shoulders, full chest, rather small face, brown hair, sandy moustache, weather-beaten appearance; dressed in brown clothes and had a dark-blue pilot overcoat. Offender drew a cheque for £2 on the Bank of New Zealand, Eketahuna, which was returned marked "No account." He also issued two other cheques for similar amounts on the 11th and 13th May last, which the complainant also cashed. Left Palmerston North for Ashhurst on the 17th ultimo.

FEILDING.—**William Joseph Baker** is charged on warrant of commitment to Dunedin Gaol for fourteen days, in default of paying £2 10s., fine and costs for procuring liquor when a prohibited person. Description: A native of England, a blacksmith, about thirty-eight years of age, 5 ft. 8 in. high, stout build, fresh complexion, blue eyes, dark-brown hair, clean-shaved except heavy moustache; generally dressed in dark suit and hard black hat. On the 27th March last he left Feilding, supposed for Dunedin, where he represented he had obtained work with Reid and Gray.

NEW PLYMOUTH.—Walter Johnston, charged with failing to comply with the terms of his release under "The First Offenders' Probation Act, 1886," is now employed as waiter at the Club Hotel, Stratford, and has promised to pay 10s. per month.

DUNEDIN.—**William Shears** is charged on warrant of commitment to Dunedin Gaol for twenty-four hours, in default of paying 8s. fine and costs for drunkenness. Description: A native of England, a labourer and gardener, sixty years of age, about 5 ft. 10 in. high, medium build, pale complexion, grey hair, beard, whiskers, and moustache; generally dressed in grey-tweed suit. On the 5th April last he was fined and allowed time to pay, but failed to do so.

UNITED STATES, AMERICA.—Description of Charles J. Walden, wanted for forgery and embezzlement, at San Rafael, California: Fifty-one years of age; a German; complexion, florid; eyes, hazel; hair, dark-brown; size of foot, 7½; round features; high, broad, retreating forehead; quite bald; small, round, projecting ears, with medium detached lobes; small square-cut nose, slightly upturned; small, oval, arching nostrils; small, round chin; well muscled;

stout build; hair on arms, breast, and stomach; several small indentures (like pock-marks) on cheeks, one on each temple; three dim vaccine-marks on each up-arm; small flesh-mole, $1\frac{1}{2}$ in., to right of centre of base of back of neck; religion, Protestant; legitimate occupation, book-keeper; education, public (college). He was convicted in San Joaquin County of forgery and embezzlement (three commitments) and sent to San Quentin Prison in 1883, his sentence being commuted in 1887. He is wanted for forgery and embezzlement committed while employed at the prison. He is a fine penman, and has a decidedly German accent. For inquiry only. NAPIER.—William Higgins, alias O'Brien, alias Price, charged with assaulting and robbing Cornelius Brosnan, has been arrested by Constable H. J. Montgomery, Auckland police, on a charge of being illegally on premises, and sentenced to three months for the offence.

OTAKI.—Charles A. Hooper, farmer, reports stolen from him at the racecourse, on the 24th ultimo, a gentlemen's silver English lever watch, No. 7556, maker Bell & Co., London; value, £6 10s.

OTAKI.—James Alexander Muir, clerk, Waikanae, reports stolen from him at the Otaki Railway-station, on the 24th ultimo, a gentlemen's silver Waltham hunting-watch, number unknown, monogram "J.A.M." engraved on outside of case, silver chain with thin links attached; value, £3. Identifiable.

OTAKI.—About 3 a.m. 25th ultimo, the Wellington and Manawatu Railway-station was broken into, and an attempt made to blow open the safe with dynamite, which had been placed in the keyhole, with about 7 in. of fuse. The order was made on the 29th September, 1900, in Christchurch, and there was due on the 9th February last the sum of £15.

WELLINGTON.—**Patrick Dooley** is charged on warrant with disobeying an order of Court to pay 2s. 6d. a week towards the support of his father. Description: A native of New Zealand, a plumber and labourer, thirty-one years of age, 5 ft. 7 in. high, medium build, fresh complexion, fair hair, blue eyes, fair moustache only; usually wears dark sac-suit and soft-felt hat. Left Wellington about March last.

MOUNT COOK (WELLINGTON).—**David Livingstone McWirter** is charged on warrant with deserting his wife, Ethel McWirter, since the 10th May last. Description: A native of Scotland, a coach-painter, twenty-six years of age, 5 ft. 8½ in. high, stout build, ruddy complexion, light-brown hair, clean-shaved except brown moustache; may be dressed in a fawn, a dark, or a grey suit, and soft black hat; he had been employed for some time by the Wellington and Manawatu Railway Company, and left on the 10th ultimo, taking his wages and money his wife had, saying he was going up-country to do some painting. It is thought he may attempt to leave the colony.

GREYMOUTH.—**Daniel Rugg** is charged on warrant with deserting his wife, Margaret Rugg, since the 21st May, 1901. Description: A native of Kumara, a bus-driver and stable-hand, twenty-three years of age, 5 ft. 7 in. or 8 in. high, full, ruddy features, brown hair, small moustache only, brown eyes, bright expression, smart, active appearance; dressed in dark-tweed trousers, fawn-coloured coat, black hard hat. Will probably make for Wellington or Auckland.

CHRISTCHURCH.—**Albert Hulme** is charged on warrant of commitment to Lyttelton Gaol for one month for disobeying an order of Court to pay 15s. a week for the maintenance of his wife, Ocean Hulme. Description: A native of New Zealand, a baker, twenty-eight years of age, 5 ft. 3½ in. high, medium build, fresh complexion, brown hair, grey eyes, first finger of right hand injured (see *Police Gazette*, 1901, page 32). Unlawful to take Oysters in Southern Subdivision of Northern Oyster-fishery.

RANFURLY, Governor.

WHEREAS it is, amongst other things, enacted by section fifteen of "The Sea-fisheries Act, 1894," that the Governor may from time to time declare any bay, estuary, or tidal waters in the colony to be an oyster-fishery, and prescribe the subdivisions thereof wherein it shall be lawful and unlawful to take oysters :

And whereas, by Warrant under the hand of the Governor dated the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the thirty-first day of the same month, the Northern Oyster-fishery was constituted and divided into subdivisions :

And whereas, by Warrant dated the twelfth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and one, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-first day of the same month, it was declared lawful to take oysters in the Southern Subdivision of the said oyster-fishery, and it is now desirable that it should be declared unlawful to take oysters in such subdivision :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the hereinbefore-recited power and authority, doth hereby declare and prescribe that it shall, on and after the first day of June, one thousand nine hundred and one, be unlawful to take oysters in the Southern Subdivision of the Northern Oyster-fishery.
