Murder.

DUNEDIN.—On the 1st instant the dead body of a newborn male child was found in Heriot Row. It was wrapped in flannel, part of an old blanket, and brown paper, and tied round with white tape. At the inquest the jury returned a verdict of "Death from violence, caused by some person or persons unknown." The medical evidence went to show that the child was born alive, and died from suffocation, the result of violence.

Escaped Lunatics.

CHARLES MCADAM escaped from the Seacliff Asylum on the 2nd instant. Description: A native of Scotland, a rabbit, forty-three years of age, 5 ft. 4 in. high, medium build, ruddy complexion, dark hair, reddish beard, whiskers, and moustache; dressed in dark-tweed suit with triangle brand, patch on trousers, tweed hat, blucher boots. Was committed from Invercargill on the 28th September, 1898.

JAMES REA who escaped from the Seacliff Asylum has been arrested by Constable G. McChesney, South Invercargill police, and returned to the asylum.

Offences not otherwise Described.

ONEHUNGA.—**John Bryant** is charged on warrant of commitment to Mount Eden Gaol for one month, in default of paying £5 7s. fine and costs for a breach of "The Alcoholic Liquors Sale Control Act, 1893." Description: Supposed English, a painter, about fifty years of age, about 6 ft. high, strong build, flabby, sallow features, shabbily dressed. Is generally about hotels.

MASTERTON.—**Thomas Lee** is charged on warrant of commitment to the Terrace Gaol, Wellington, in default of paying £3 1s. for assault. Description: Colonial, a labourer, about twenty-three years of age, 5 ft. 7 in. high, stout build, dark, ruddy complexion, grey eyes, clean shaved, dressed in blue sac suit, brown Dr. Jim hat. May be found at some of the sheep-stations in the district.

ASHBURTON.—**Samuel Elliott** is charged on warrant with having, on the 10th May, 1901, threatened to do grievous bodily harm to Jane Smith, boardinghouse-keeper, Ashburton. Description: A native of Ireland, a labourer, forty-five years of age, 5 ft. 8 in. high, swarthy complexion, brown hair, grey eyes. (See *Police Gazette*, 1893, page 25). Supposed gone to North Island. His arrest is not desired unless he is found in Ashburton.

DUNEDIN.—William R. Cooksley, licensee Salutation Hotel, reports that on the 27th May, 1901, a man, name unknown, obtained £5 10s. from him by means of a valueless cheque for the above amount, purporting to be drawn by Bishop Verdon in favour of Michael Hayes. Offender is about thirty-eight years of age, about 5 ft. 10 in. high, medium build, thin red beard, florid complexion, large nose, prominent nostrils, lips, and teeth. He obtained the blank cheque from A. and J. McFarlane.

DUNEDIN.—**Robert Kirk** is charged on two warrants of commitment to Dunedin Gaol, one for one month, in default of paying £5 6s. fine and costs for a breach of the peace; and the other for seven days, in default of paying £2 3s. fine and costs for a breach of the City by-laws. Description: A native of New Zealand, a cabdriver and shearer, thirty-four years of age, 5 ft. 11 in. high, medium build, fresh complexion, light-brown hair, ginger moustache only, dark eyes. Supposed gone to New South Wales.

Description: A native of Finland, a carpenter's improver, twenty-six years of age, about 5 ft. 8 in. high, sallow complexion, brown eyes, high cheek-bones, brown hair, small moustache only; anchor, cross, and heart tattooed on back of left hand; H and cross on right hand, above the thumb. AUCKLAND.—Walter Charles Marlborough, known as Professor Besant, is charged on warrant with deserting his wife, Rebecca Marlborough, since the 1st March last. Description: A native of England, coal-miner and labourer, forty-five years of age, 5 ft. 7 in. high, stout build, dark complexion, brown hair turning grey, goatee and moustache, brown eyes, round full face, small tattoo mark on one arm; when last seen was wearing a blue-serge suit, and hard black hat. He came from Inangahua to Westport with Ellen Reardon, and promised to marry her, but left her destitute on the 20th March last at Westport.

CHRISTCHURCH.—Joseph Jones is charged on warrant with disobeying an order of Court to pay 7s. a week towards the support of his illegitimate child. Description: A German Jew, about twenty-eight years of age, about 5 ft. 3 in. high, medium build, inclined to be stout, sharp features, light-brown hair, florid complexion, clean shaved except reddish moustache, dressed in dark-blue clothes, soft-felt hat, wears watch and silver chain, plain gold breast-stud, gold links, wears two rings on third finger of left hand. Description: Colonial, a labourer, about thirty years of age, 5 ft. 10 in. or 11 in. high, stout build, sallow complexion, dark-brown hair, brown eyes, dark-brown moustache, small side-whiskers; dressed in black coat and vest, dark trousers, dark-drab slouch hat; carries a carved walking-stick. He left Normanby on the 15th April last, and is supposed to have gone to Auckland. On the 12th March last there was due the sum of £2 10s.

Description: Colonial, twenty-six years of age, a farm labourer, 5 ft. 9 in. or 10 in. high, stout build, brown hair, clean shaved. Parents reside at Temuka, and he has relatives at Oamaru and Christchurch. May attempt to leave the colony. Complainant, Emily Keenan, Glenavy.

WAIMATE.—**Joseph Johnson** is charged on warrant with failing to provide for the maintenance of his illegitimate child. Description: A native of Australia, a labourer, twenty-six years of age, about 5 ft. 7 in. high, slight build, dark complexion, hair, and eyes, clean-shaved except heavy brown moustache, snub nose, turns in toes when walking, generally wears dark suit, tweed cap or black hat. Was working at a threshing-mill, and left Waimate on the 27th ultimo, supposed going north, and may try to leave the colony. Complainant, Beatrice Annie Loper, Waimate.

DUNEDIN.—**Horatio Nelson Pine** is charged on warrant of commitment to Dunedin Gaol for three months for disobeying an order of Court to pay 12s. a week towards the support of his three children. Description: A native of England, a labourer, fifty-five years of age, 5 ft. 10 in. high, strong build, fresh complexion, brown hair and eyes, reddish goatee turning grey, usually dressed in light-grey tweed suit. Was last heard of in Wellington district, and may attempt to leave the colony. The sum of £9 14s. was in arrears on the 28th February, 1901.

DUNEDIN.—**James William Waldie** is charged on warrant with deserting his wife, Naomi Waldie, since the 7th May, 1901.
