#### Murder.

DUNEDIN .- On the 1st instant the dead body of a new-DUNEDIN.—On the 1st instant the dead body of a new-born male child was found in Heriot Row. It was wrapped in flannel, part of an old blanket, and brown paper, and tied round with white tape. At the inquest the jury returned a verdict of "Death from violence, caused by some person or persons unknown." The medical evidence went to show that the child was born alive, and died from suffocation, the result of violence.

## Escaped Lunatics.

CHARLES McADAM escaped from the Seacliff Asylum on the 2nd Instant. Description: A native of Scotland, a rabbiter, forty-three years of age, 5 ft. 4 in. high, medium build, ruddy complexion, dark hair, reddish beard, whiskers, and moustache; dressed in dark-tweed suit with triangle brand, patch on trousers, tweed hat, blucher boots. Was committed from Invercargill on the 28th September, 1898.
