Offences not otherwise Described.

Auckland.—P. Fulton is charged on warrant with false pretences on John McMaster, draper, Queen Street, on the 30th September last. Description: Supposed colonial, about thirty-three years of age, about 5 ft. 9 in. high, medium build, dark-brown hair, moustache only; dressed in grey-tweed suit and light skull-cap. He gave complainant a cheque for £5 on the Bank of New South Wales, New Plymouth, and represented he was carrying on business there as P. Fulton and Co. The cheque was returned marked "No. a/c." Offender left Auckland on the above date by the s.s. "Elingamite," for Sydney, under the name of Campbell. Other charges pending. Complainant will not pay cost of extradition.

Auckland.—James Thompson is charged on warrant with threatening behaviour to Constable Hugh Cox, at Auckland, on the 20th August last. Description: A native of Ireland, shoemaker, thirty-five years of age, 5 ft. 8% in. high, medium build, fair complexion, dark-brown hair, blue eyes, bald on front of head (see Police Gazette, 1901, page 77). He may be found about the gumfields.

Waihi.—Thomas Radford, charged with false pretences on J. E. Taylor, has been arrested by Constable W. H. Ryan, Stratford police.

Whangarei.—Thomas Johnston, contractor, reports that on the night of the 3rd instant an attempt was made to poison him by putting strychnine into a flask of whisky. About 5.30 a.m. on the 4th instant he found a sugar-bag cut in two tied to his door-handle. It contained a flask of "Best Old Blended Scotch Whisky," bottled by Campbell and Ehrenfried, and on a piece of brown paper was written in pencil, "T. Johnsen was up; call again.—T.S." He took

some of the whisky, and was shortly afterwards ill, and the contents of the flask, on being examined by Dr. Sweet, were found to contain strychnine. Complainant has no suspicion of any one, and was living alone, his wife being in Auckland.

HUNTERVILLE.—Alfred Barnes, manager, Bank of New Zealand, reports that about 5.45 p.m. on the 8th instant, when driving from Mangaweka to Hunterville with about £1,700 in notes, gold, and cheques, an attempt was made to rob him. When about half a mile from Mangaonoho a shot was fired from the side of the road from a double-barrelled gun, which was pointed over a log, and the horse struck with a bullet. The man, after the shot was fired, ran towards the Rangitikei River, and was indistinctly seen by complainant, who describes him as about 5 ft. 10 in. high, strong active build; dressed in dark-grey coat, light-coloured pants, and soft-felt hat. The bullet penetrated the flank of the horse, and is supposed to be for a Winchester rifle; on top of the log were two U.M.C. New Club cartridges, No. 4 shot. Identification of offender doubtful.

INSPECTORS in charge are requested to ascertain the number of the above likely to be required before the 30th June next and forward requisitions for the same as early as pos-The blankets will then be forwarded from the Police Store to the headquarters of each district, from where they are to be issued to stations only as required, advantage being taken whenever practicable of sending them by members of the Force when proceeding to out-stations.

Requisitions for further supplies should be made annually on the 1st July, the numbers being based on the average

requirements of preceding years.

Care is to be taken that the blankets do not become damaged by moths, &c., while stored at district headquarters.
