Escaped Lunatic.

ALFRED GEORGE MABIN escaped from the Mount View Asylum on the 6th instant. Description: A native of New Zealand, about thirty-seven years of age, about 5ft. 7 in. or 8 in. high, thick-set, light-brown hair, short fair beard and moustache; dressed in white-moleskin trousers. He left his coat, vest, and boots behind, but may be wearing a dark mackintosh. His wife resides in Woolcombe Street, Wellington.
