## NEW ZEALAND POLICE GAZETTE.

When notifying the arrest of persons charged with larceny, or suspected of larceny, it should be stated whether the property stolen, or any portion of it, has been recovered.

A description of property supposed to be stolen, found in the possession of offenders, for which owners cannot be found, should be furnished for insertion in the *Gazette*.

### Escaped Lunatic.

ALFRED GEORGE MABIN escaped from the Mount View Asylum on the 6th instant. Description: A native of New Zealand, about thirty-seven years of age, about 5 ft. 7 in. or 8 in. high, thick-set, light-brown hair, short fair beard and moustache; dressed in white-moleskin trousers. He left his coat, vest, and boots behind, but may be wearing a dark mackintosh. His wife resides in Woolcombe Street, Wellington.

### Offences not otherwise Described.

AUCKLAND.—**Fred Wilson** is charged on warrant of commitment to Mount Eden Gaol for forty-eight hours in default of paying £1 3s., fine and costs, for a breach of the borough by-laws. Description: English, a cabdriver, thirty-two years of age, about 5 ft. 5 in. high, slight build, dark complexion and hair, very dark moustache. Supposed to have gone to northern Wairoa.

AUCKLAND.—James Thompson, charged with threatening behaviour to Constable Hugh Cox, has been arrested by Constable P. Ross, Auckland police, and fined £2 or fourteen days' hard labour.

WANGANUI.—**Ernest Henderson**, or *Anderson*, is charged with false pretences on Mrs. Sarah Nichol, boardinghouse-keeper, on the 22nd ultimo. Description: Supposed colonial, about twenty-two years of age, 5 ft. 9 in. or 10 in. high, medium build, fair complexion and hair, small blue eyes rather deeply set, very narrow thin features, rather pointed chin, no hair on face; dressed in blue- or black-diagonal coat and vest very much worn, dark-grey saddle-tweed trousers, and grey cap. He obtained two weeks' board and lodgings by falsely representing he had a cheque for £150 for bushfelling. No warrant.

HUNTERVILLE.—**John Owen** is charged on warrant of commitment to Wanganui Gaol for forty-eight hours in default of paying £1 3s., fine and costs now due for a breach of the by-laws. Description: A native of Sydney, a tinsmith, twenty-eight years of age, 5 ft. 10 in. high, fair complexion, light-brown hair, grey eyes, medium build, recently clean-shaved; usually dressed in navy-blue sac suit and hard black-felt hat. He left Mangaweka on the 15th ultimo, and is well known in the Pemberton district.

WELLINGTON.—**Marion Scott** is charged on warrant with absconding from bail. Description: A native of New Zealand, barmaid, twenty-four years of age, 5 ft. 6 in. high, stout build, fresh complexion, dark hair, blue eyes. She was committed for trial to the next sittings of the Supreme Court, Wellington, for theft, and was admitted to bail in the sum of £20.

ASHBURTON.—Charles Smith Todd, labourer, reports that at 11.10 p.m., 1st instant, he was assaulted and robbed by two men, names unknown, of a new £1 note, 19s. in silver, a new two-bladed Pampa knife, and a pawn-ticket for a silver watch and two silver rings pledged at Shrimpton's, Christchurch; name on pawn-ticket, Tod. Description: First—Supposed native of Sydney, about thirty-five years of age, 5 ft. 8 in. or 9 in. high, stout build, fresh complexion, brown hair, clean-shaved except brown moustache, one side of face swollen; dressed in light-tweed suit, light Dr. Jim hat, boots much worn. He held the complainant round the neck while the other man robbed him. Identifiable, as he got a drink and tobacco from Todd in the Somerset Hotel the same evening. No description can be given of the second man.

DUNEDIN.—**David Barclay** is charged on warrant with attempted buggery on Lawrence O'Brien, a school-boy, on the 5th instant, at Woodhaugh. Description: A native of New Zealand, a labourer, twenty-seven years of age, about 5 ft. 4 in. high, stout build, fair complexion, round face, blue eyes, very fair hair, fair moustache only, projects out; usually wears a Dr. Jim hat. ### Housebreaking, Stealing from the Person, &c.

Identifiable.

## Deserting Wives and Families, &amp;c.

AUCKLAND.—**Henry Thomas Spain** is charged on warrant with disobeying an order of the Court to pay £1 a week towards the support of his wife. Description: A native of India, a labourer, thirty-six years of age, 5 ft. 5½ in. high, fresh complexion, light-brown hair, grey eyes, medium nose, upper front tooth out, top off third left finger (see *Police Gazette*, 1899, page 245). May be found working on the goldfields, under the name of Payne or Thomas. There was £26 due up to the 27th August last.

WANGANUI.—**William Morris** is charged on warrant with deserting his children. Description: Supposed native of New Zealand, a labourer, about thirty-eight years of age, 5 ft. 6 in. or 7 in. high, medium build, dark complexion and hair, dark eyes, full face, clean-shaved except dark moustache, quiet manner, generally works bushfelling or at flax-mills. On the 13th February, 1900, he placed his children in the Wanganui Infants' Home and agreed to pay £1 a week for their support, but has only made two payments. He left Taihape on the 1st April last, and was seen in Wellington in July. He formerly resided in Shannon.

MOUNT COOK (WELLINGTON).—**Joseph Weir Simmonds** is charged on warrant with failing to provide for the future maintenance of his unborn illegitimate child. Description: A native of England, a carpenter, nineteen years of age, about 5 ft. 8 in. high, stout build, olive complexion, grey-blue eyes, round full features, no hair on face, usually wears a serge sac suit and cap or straw hat.
