Offences not otherwise Described.

AUCKLAND.—**Anthony Lyttelton Musgrove** is charged on warrant of commitment to Auckland prison for one week in default of paying £1 6s. fine and costs for threatening behaviour. Description: Irish, seaman, sixty years of age, 5ft. 8½ in. high, medium build, fresh complexion, brown hair, grey eyes. On the 15th October last he was convicted and fined. He stated he resided at Otahuhu, but no trace can be obtained of him there.

AUCKLAND.—**Martha McManus** is charged on warrant with having at Auckland on the 2nd ultimo used obscene language. Description: A native of Auckland, a prostitute, twenty-eight years of age, 5ft. 6 in. high, medium build, fair complexion, brown hair, grey eyes. Supposed to be on the gumfields.

Description: A native of New Zealand, a groom, twenty-seven years of age, 5ft. 4 in. high, medium build, fair complexion, brown hair, grey eyes (see *Police Gazette*, 1900, page 144). Description: A native of Ireland, labourer, 5ft. 6 in. high, sallow complexion, black hair, light-blue eyes, left arm off at elbow (see *Police Gazette*, 1899, page 48, and 1900, page 114, as Shea). He is also charged on warrant with theft at Methven.

DUNEDIN.—**Thomas Skene** is charged on warrant of commitment to Dunedin Gaol for fourteen days in default of paying £2 18s. fine and costs for being on licensed premises during the currency of a prohibition order. May be identical with George Reid, of Normanby, well known to spicers and jockeys.
