Offences not otherwise Described.

AUCKLAND. - Anthony Lyttelton Musgrove charged on warrant of commitment to Auckland prison for one week in default of paying £1 6s. fine and costs for threatening behaviour. Description: Irish, seaman, sixty years of age, 5ft. 8\frac{3}{2} in. high, medium build, fresh complexion, brown hair, grey eyes. On the 15th October last he was convicted and fined. He stated he resided at Otahuhu, but no trace can be obtained of him there.
