## NEW ZEALAND POLICE GAZETTE.

### Arson.

**WELLINGTON SOUTH.**—On the night of the 13th ultimo an attempt was made to burn down an unoccupied house in Rintoul Street, the property of Mrs. Emily Pierard. The walls were saturated with kerosene, and part of the scrim and paper burned.

**AUCKLAND.**—John Delaney, charged with false pretences on J. E. Taylor, has been arrested by Detective P. T. McMahon, Auckland police. His correct name is John Sheard.

**FOXTON.**—**Edward Charles Ferris** (known as Teddy Ferris) is charged on warrant with having indecently assaulted Amy Harris, a child fourteen years of age, on or about October last. Description: Supposed colonial, labourer, thirty-four years of age, about 5 ft. 4 in. high, active, medium build, dark complexion, dark hair turning grey, clean-shaved, theatrical appearances; sings well, and plays the banjo and piano; dressed in blue-serge suit, black Dr. Jim hat or dark-tweed cap, tan boots. When in Wellington stops at Clyde Quay Hotel, and has a relation residing at No. 280, Colombo Street, Christchurch. The complainant is six months *enroute* to offender, and may not get over the confinement. Offender was recently in Christchurch, and intended going to Dunedin.

**HASTINGS.**—J. W. Bates, chemist, reports that on the 28th ultimo a forged cheque for £2 10s., purporting to be signed by Henry Scott, was uttered to him by *George Stevens*. Description: Supposed English, a labourer, forty-four years of age, 5 ft. 8 in. high, medium build, dark hair and moustache; suffers from heart disease. Identifiable. He obtained medicine from the complainant, and also £2 7s. change.

Description: A native of Palmerston, a labourer, twenty-five years of age, about 5 ft. 9 in. high, stout build, fresh complexion, dark hair, no hair on face; dressed in dark-tweed suit and soft black-felt hat; is fond of drink. The sum of £4 12s. is now due on both warrants.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this twenty-eighth day of November, 1901.

Present:

THE HONOURABLE W. C. WALKER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the seventeenth section of "The Sea-fisheries Act, 1894," that the Governor may, by Order in Council, from time to time declare any bay, or portion of a bay, estuary, or tidal waters in the colony in the vicinity of any Native pa or village, to be an oyster-fishery where Natives exclusively may take oysters

for their own food at all times, irrespective of the provisions of the said Act:

And whereas it is desirable that certain portions of the tidal waters of Manukau Harbour, in the vicinity of a Native pa or village, should be such an oyster-fishery:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the hereinbefore-mentioned power and authority, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby declare that the portions of the tidal waters of Manukau Harbour which are coloured red on plan marked M.D. 2490, which is deposited in the Office of the Marine Department at Wellington, shall be an oyster-fishery where Natives exclusively may take oysters for their own food, irrespective of the provisions of the said Act.

### Extracts from New South Wales Police Gazette.

Weaver, Robert A. Maggs, and Webber. Arrest of offender very desirable.*

COBAR.—A warrant has been issued by the Cobar Bench for the arrest of W. S. Asquith, charged with forging a cheque for £6 on Commercial Banking Company, Sydney, purporting to be drawn by J. A. Bradley, and uttering the same to Henry Davis, of Wrightville. Offender is twenty-three years of age, 5 ft. 7 in. high, rather stout build, brown hair, fair complexion, eyes deeply sunk, thick lips, clean-shaved, hair cut very short; dressed in blue-serge or cricketer's suit, and drab-felt hat with light band; a journalist.
