The arrest of offenders described in the *Police Gazette*, or respecting whom crime reports have been forwarded for insertion in the *Gazette*, should be promptly notified by the member of the Force effecting the arrest.

When notifying the arrest of persons charged with larceny, or suspected of larceny, it should be stated whether the property stolen, or any portion of it, has been recovered.

A description of property supposed to be stolen, found in the possession of offenders, for which owners cannot be found, should be furnished for insertion in the *Gazette*.

Offences not otherwise Described.

AUCKLAND.—**Charles Ward** (may be known as Alfred Ward) is charged on warrant with a breach of the Chattels Act on or about the 9th January, 1902. Description: A grocer, about thirty-five years of age, about 5 ft. 10 in. high, dark complexion, dark moustache, probably scrubby beard, dark clothes, skull-cap or dark Dr. Jim hat. Offender sold certain chattels without consent of the grantee, John Snaith. He left the district about the 20th December last. He has a large square tent, and may be found at seaside resorts or on the gumfield; his wife and three children will probably be with him.

AUCKLAND.—**John Broughton Stafford** is charged on warrant with false pretences on William Mathieson, licensee, Falls Hotel, between the 23rd and 26th December, 1901. Description: A native of Yorkshire, England, about forty eight years of age, about 6 ft. 2 in. high, military appearance, blue piercing eyes, fair complexion, clean-shaved except brown moustache; dressed in light pepper-and-salt-coloured shabby tweed suit, black-and-white plaid cap, well educated, very talkative, bullet-wound in right leg and spear-wound in left side near the heart. He obtained refreshment, board, and lodging to the amount of £5 5s. by falsely representing that he was manager of the Waitekauri Gold-mining Company.

HASTINGS.—**Charles Ellis** is charged on warrant of commitment to Napier Gaol for one month in default of paying £3 10s., fine and costs for being found on licensed premises while prohibited. Description: A native of America, a sawyer, forty-eight years of age, 5 ft. 5 in. high, fresh complexion, brown hair, blue eyes, thick nose; dressed in dirty brown coat and cap, dungaree trousers (see *Police Gazette*, 1901, page 152).

HASTINGS.—**George Edhouse, alias Henry Edgehurst**, is charged on warrant of commitment to Napier Gaol for one month in default of paying £3 12s., fine and costs for procuring liquor for a prohibited person. Description: A native of England, a labourer and timber clerk, fifty-two years of age, 5 ft. 9½ in. high, dark complexion, dark hair turning grey, brown eyes (see *Police Gazette*, 1902, page 31); dressed in dirty brown suit and soft black hat.

HAWERA.—**James Dwyer** is charged on warrant with having, on the 14th December, 1901, obtained credit by fraud to the amount of £245, from Arthur Albert Fantham, auctioneer. Description: A native of Ireland, farmer, twenty-eight years of age, 5 ft. 11 in. high, strong, active build, about 14 stone weight, black hair, slight black moustache only, grey eyes, nose slightly turned up at the point; may be wearing a blue knickerbocker suit. He recently had a farm at Tariki Road, near Inglewood, and formerly came from Humphrey's Valley, Hokitika. A woman named Mrs. McFadgen was staying at the Pier Hotel, Wellington, with offender. She left for Auckland on the 16th ultimo, and may be with him there, as letters were recently received from him posted at Auckland. He purchased the cattle at auction and undertook not to dispose of them for a month, but sold them within a week, and appropriated the money.

CHRISTCHURCH.—Theodore *alias* Albert Harwood, Reid, and Ward, charged with forgery and uttering: Offender Reid has been arrested by Detective R. Marsack, Christchurch police, on information supplied by Acting-Detective A. Cameron, Wellington police, and remanded. He is identical with Joseph Jackson, convicted of forgery in Dunedin (see *Police Gazette*, 1900, page 93). The third offender, Ward, is identical with Patrick McKay, convicted of house-breaking at Dunedin (see *Police Gazette*, 1901, page 11), and is now supposed to be in Wellington.

LYTTELTON.—**James Wilford McKeever, alias McIvor, alias McIvon**, is charged on warrant with having, on the 25th ultimo, damaged the property of Michael Roche to the value of £35. Description: A native of London or Scotland, of Irish parents, fireman, about thirty-seven years of age, about 5 ft. 7 in. high, medium build, fair complexion and hair, clean-shaved except small fair moustache, round features, large brown eyes, hoarse voice, "Faith Hope and Charity" tattooed on one forearm; usually wears dark-blue serge suit, has a dark-cloth sac coat with velvet collar, black-leather shoes, and hard brown hat. He was boarding with complainant, and wilfully destroyed the furniture to the above amount. He is supposed to have gone by the s.s. "Koonya" to Greymouth.

LYTTELTON.—Donald MacRae, charged with default of fine and costs for being on licensed premises when prohibited, has been arrested by the Lyttelton police on charges of theft, and remanded to Dunedin.

TIMARU.—**William Gunn** is charged on warrant with false pretences on John Dore, hotelkeeper, on the 4th ultimo. Description: Supposed native of England, commercial traveller, forty-six years of age, 5 ft. 8 in. high, medium build, fair hair tinged with grey, long sandy beard whiskers and moustache, respectable appearance, walks awkwardly with toes turned out; dressed in dark suit and hard black-felt hat. Supposed to have come to Wellington. Offender obtained £4 19s. by falsely representing he was still employed by Mr. Waghorne, of Dunedin.

KAITANGATA.—**William Burns** is charged on warrant of commitment to Dunedin Gaol for three months in default of paying £4 5s., fine and costs for resisting the police. Description: A native of New Zealand, labourer, about twenty-seven years of age, 6 ft. 8 in. high, medium build, fresh complexion, brown hair, greyish eyes, clean-shaved except moustache, square shoulders, holds his head down when walking; dressed in brown-tweed suit and soft black-felt hat. He was working on a farm near Stirling, and left there on the 29th ultimo.

AUCKLAND.—**Samuel Hughes**, stevedore, Lyttelton, reports stolen from him, on the s.s. "Moura," on the 18th ultimo, a ladies' silver Geneva open-faced watch, dent in side, white dial, no glass on face, and a ladies' long gold chain with short links; value, £3 5s. Identifiable.

AUCKLAND.—**Florence A. Tyrer**, school-teacher, Stratford, reports stolen from her bedroom in Kidd's Hotel, on the 4th or 5th instant, two £10 notes and twelve £1 notes. Not identifiable. Suspicion attached to *Joseph Raw*, colonial, about thirty years of age, 5 ft. 6 in. high, dark-brown hair and moustache, high cheek-bones, pointed chin, freckled face, mark or scar on bridge of nose; dressed in blue-cloth suit, grey Dr. Jim hat, white tie; frequents racecourses. He was staying at the hotel, and is supposed to have gone to New Plymouth.

Identifiable. A man was heard in the room, and on being pursued broke through the window and escaped. No reliable description can be given of him.

Suspicion attached to *Thomas Henry*, alias *Thomas Henry Calvert*. Description: A native of Auckland, labourer, twenty-six years of age, 5 ft. 5 in. high, fair complexion, light-brown hair, dark-blue eyes, long nose (see *Police Gazette*, 1900, page 27).

"Moura," between Napier and Wellington, on the 20th ultimo, a gentlemen's open-faced silver English lever watch (maker's name and number unknown) and a silver curb chain; value, £2. Identifiable.

WELLINGTON.—John Edward Jenkinson, 8, Customhouse Quay, reports supposed stolen, on or about the 1st December 1899, a Victor bicycle, No. 86142; value, £11. Identifiable. Suspicion attached to *William P. L. Tobin*, a canvasser and hotel-hand, a good piano-player, about thirty-five years of age, 5 ft. 8 in. high, medium build, dark complexion and moustache; usually dressed in dark clothes. He hired the bicycle, and was last heard of at Kaitioura or Blenheim in June, 1900, where he had been employed canvassing for the Government Life Insurance.

The letter, which was not registered, was posted on the train, and addressed to Mr. G. Manley, coal merchant, Oamaru, who failed to receive it.

ALEXANDRA.—*George Carter*, alias *Richard Tempest*, is charged on warrant with theft, on the 24th ultimo, of a road-racing Record bicycle, No. 387, makers Cooke, Howlinson, and Co., Dunedin, the property of Norman L. Reid, watchmaker; value, £20. Identifiable. Offender is a native of New Zealand, a theatrical, about twenty-six years of age, about 5 ft. 9 in. high, medium build, fresh complexion, fair hair, clean-shaved; has been recently touring the gold-fields with Barrie Marehall; dressed in dark-tweed sac suit and hard black-felt hat; lifts heavy weights with his teeth. He hired the bicycle to ride to Roxburgh to engage the hall for the Valdares, but has not been seen since, and has probably sold the bicycle.

AUCKLAND.—**John Bowes Monkman** is charged on warrant with deserting his wife since the 24th ultimo. Description: A native of England, thirty years of age, 5 ft. 9 in. high, fair hair and moustache, bald on top of head, blue eyes; travels about hawking in a trap made by Cousins and Cousins, Auckland, drawn by a white horse. Was last heard of at Papakura.

Regulations for Trout, &c., Fishing, County of Westland Acclimatisation District.

RANFURLY, Governor.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this thirty-first day of January, 1902.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations for the County of Westland Acclimatisation District—a district duly appointed under "The Animals Protection Act, 1880"—and the waters thereof, except as hereinafter mentioned; and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall take effect on and after the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

1. Licenses to fish for trout in all the waters of the County of Westland Acclimatisation District (with the exception of the Kanieri River, in which fishing is prohibited) will be issued by the Secretary of the Westland Acclimatisation Society, and for every such license a fee of twenty shillings shall be charged: Provided that it shall not be obligatory upon the said Secretary to issue a license: Provided further that it shall be lawful for the said Secretary to issue licenses for

the whole season to women for the sum of five shillings each; and to boys under sixteen years of age for the sum of ten shillings each; and to men, on and after the twentieth day of December in any year, for the sum of twelve shillings and sixpence each.

2. Licenses when issued as aforesaid for the whole season shall entitle the person named therein to fish in any of the said waters from the first day of October in any one year to the fifteenth day of April in the year following; but no such license shall confer any right of entry upon the land of any person without his consent.

3. No person shall fish for, take, catch, or kill, or have in his possession, or attempt to fish for, take, catch, or kill, in any manner whatever, any of the salmonidæ or trout except during the abovementioned period.

4. Every such license shall entitle the person named therein to fish with rod and line only, and with the following baits: Natural or artificial fly, natural or artificial minnow and any small indigenous fish, grasshoppers, beetles, spiders, caterpillars, creepers, and worms.

5. No person shall use any other bait, or any method, device, or contrivance of any sort or kind whatever for the purpose of fishing for, taking, catching, or killing trout, except a rod or line, and a landing-net or gaff for fish taken with rod and line.

6. No cross-line fishing, stroke-hauling, or any other sportsmanlike device shall be used for the purpose of taking, catching, or killing trout; nor shall any of the baits abovementioned be used with any medicated or chemical preparation whatever.

7. No person shall take or attempt to take trout without a license; and every person taking or attempting to take trout shall, on demand of any ranger, constable, or person producing a license, produce and show to such ranger, constable, or person his license and the contents of his creel or bag, and the bait used by him for taking, catching, or killing trout.

8. Every trout not exceeding nine inches in length from nose to tip of tail, taken or caught by any person, shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

9. No person shall put, throw, or place, or allow to be put, thrown, or placed in any of the said waters any sawdust or sawmill refuse, or anything of any kind or description whatever poisonous, deleterious, or noxious to fish. This shall not apply to *débris* or tailings from mining claims.

10. No person shall take, fish for, catch, or kill in any manner whatever, or have in his possession, any salmon, salmon parr or smolts, or the ova, young, or fry of any salmon in any stage whatever; and any of the abovenamed taken by accident or otherwise shall immediately be returned to the water from whence it was taken.

11. No person other than is provided by the regulations for taking lake trout shall sell, or expose or offer for sale, or have in his possession for purpose of sale, within the district to which these regulations relate, any of the salmonidæ, trout, perch, tench, or carp, or take, or fish for, catch, or kill any of the salmonidæ, trout, perch, tench, or carp, in order to make sale of same.

12. Any fish-dealer having on his business premises any of the salmonidæ, trout, perch, tench, or carp, shall be deemed to have them in his possession for the purpose of sale.

13. No person shall put, throw, drag, draw, or place, or allow to be put, thrown, dragged, drawn, or placed, for any purpose whatever, any net of any description (except a landing-net) in any of the rivers or streams in the said district, or within half a mile of the mouth or entrance of any such waters, except as may be provided in regulations authorising the taking of lake trout.

14. Licenses to fish for perch, carp, and tench only, in all the waters of the County of Westland Acclimatisation District, will be issued by the Secretary of the society, and for any such license a fee of five shillings shall be paid: Provided that it shall not be obligatory upon the said Secretary to issue a license: Provided further that a license to fish for trout shall be deemed to include permission, subject to these regulations, to fish for perch, tench, or carp.

15. No person shall take, catch, or kill any perch or tench under six inches in length; nor shall any perch, tench, or carp be taken, caught, or killed at all, or had in possession of any person, between the sixteenth day of April and the first day of December in any year.

16. The penalty for the breach of any of these regulations shall not be more than five pounds nor less than five shillings.

ALL that area in the Land Districts of Canterbury and Otago, containing about 294,000 acres, bounded towards the north-west by the summit of the Southern Alps from Mount Jackson to Mount Burns; thence towards the north and east by the watershed between the River Dobson and the Tasman River to Ben Ohau Range; thence by the summit of that range to Mount Ostler; thence towards the east by a right line to the Ohau River at a point one mile above the crossing of the road to Pukaki; thence towards the south generally by the leading spur and the watershed between Lake Ohau and the Wairepo River; and towards the west by the watershed between Lake Ohau and the Ahuriri River, and the watershed between the Hopkins and Hunter Rivers to Mount Jackson, the place of commencement.
