When notifying the arrest of persons charged with larceny, or suspected of larceny, it should be stated whether the property stolen, or any portion of it, has been recovered.

Offences not otherwise Described.

AUCKLAND .- Charles Ward (may be known as Alfred Ward) is charged on warrant with a breach of the Chattels Act on or about the 9th January, 1902. Description: A grocer, about thirty-five years of age, about 5 ft. 10 in. high, dark complexion, dark moustache, probably scrubby beard, dark clothes, skull-cap or dark Dr. Jim hat. Offender sold certain chattels without consent of the grantee, John Snaith. He left the district about the 20th December last. He has a large square tent, and may be found at seaside resorts or on the gumfield; his wife and three children will probably be with him.

AUCKLAND.-John Broughton Stafford is charged on warrant with false pretences on William Mathieson, licensee, Falls Hotel, between the 23rd and 26th December, 1901. Description: A native of Yorkshire, England, about forty eight years of age, about 6ft. 2 in. high, military ap-pearance, blue piercing eyes, fair complexion, clean-shaved except brown moustache; dressed in light pepper-and-salt-coloured shabby tweed suit, black-and-white plaid cap, well educated, very talkative, bullet-wound in right leg and spearwound in left side near the heart. He obtained refreshment, board, and lodging to the amount of £5 5s. by falsely representing that he was manager of the Waitekauri Goldmining Company.

HASTINGS.-Charles Ellis is charged on warrant of commitment to Napier Gaol for one month in default of paying £3 10s., fine and costs for being found on licensed premises while prohibited. Description: A native of America, a sawyer, forty-eight years of age, 5 ft. 5 in. high, fresh complexion, brown hair, blue eyes, thick nose; dressed in dirty brown coat and cap, dungaree trousers (see *Police* Gazette, 1901, page 152).

HASTINGS. — George Edhouse, alias Henry Edge-hurst, is charged on warrant of commitment to Napier Gaol for one month in default of paying £3 12s., fine and costs for procuring liquor for a prohibited person. Descrip-tion: A native of England, a labourer and timber clerk, fity-two years of age, 5 ft. 9²/₂ in. high, dark complexion, dark hair turning grey, brown eyes (see *Police Gazette*, 1902, page 31); dressed in dirty brown suit and soft black hat.

HAWERA.-James Dwyer is charged on warrant with having, on the 14th December, 1901, obtained credit by fraud auctioneer. Description : A native of Ireland, farmer, twenty-eight years of age, 5 ft. 11 in. high, strong, active build, about 14 stone weight, black hair, slight black build, about 14 scone weight, black hair, sight black moustache only, grey eyes, nose slightly turned up at the point; may be wearing a blue knickerbocker suit. He recently had a farm at Tariki Road, near Inglewood, and formerly came from Humphrey's Valley, Hokitika. A woman named Mrs. McFadgen was staying at the Pier Hotel, Wellington, with offender. She left for Auckland on the 16th ultimo, and may be with him there, as letters were recently received from him posted at Auckland the puer recently received from him posted at Auckland. He pur-chased the cattle at auction and undertook not to dispose of them for a month, but sold them within a week, and appropriated the money.

The third offender, Ward, is identical with Patrick McKay, convicted of house-breaking at Dunedin (see Police Gazette, 1901, page 11). breaking at Dunedin (see Police Gazette, 1901, page 11), and is now supposed to be in Wellington.

LYTTELTON. - James Wilford McKeever, alias McIvor, alias McIvon, is charged on warrant with having, on the 25th ultimo, damaged the property of Michael Roche to the value of £35. Description : A native of London or Scotland, of Irish parents, fireman, about thirty-seven years of age, about 5 ft. 7 in. high, medium build, fair complexion and hair, clean-shaved except small fair moustache, round features, large brown eyes, hoarse voice, "Faith Hope and Charity" tattooed on one forearm ; usually wears darkblue serge suit, has a dark-cloth sac coat with velvet collar, black-leather shoes, and hard brown hat. He was boarding with complainant, and wilfully destroyed the furniture to the above amount. He is supposed to have gone by the s.s. "Koonya" to Greymouth.

Regulations for Trout, &c., Fishing, County of Westland Acclimatisation District.

RANFURLY, Governor.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this thirty-first day of January, 1902.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

N pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884," His Ex-cellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations for the Said cooldy, doth hereby make the following regula-tions for the County of Westland Acclimatisation District— a district duly appointed under "The Animals Protection Act, 1880"—and the waters thereof, except as hereinafter mentioned; and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall take effect on and after the date of the publication thereof in the New Zealand Gazette.

REGULATIONS.

1. Licenses to fish for trout in all the waters of the County of Westland Acclimatisation District (with the exception of the Kanieri River, in which fishing is prohibited) will be issued by the Secretary of the Westland Acclimatisation Society, and for every such license a fee of twenty shillings shall be charged: Provided that it shall not be obligatory upon the said Secretary to issue a license: Provided further that it shall be lawful for the said Secretary to issue licenses for

the whole season to women for the sum of five shillings each; and to boys under sixteen years of age for the sum of ten shillings each; and to men, on and after the twentieth day of December in any year, for the sum of twelve shillings and sixpence each.

2. Licenses when issued as aforesaid for the whole season shall entitle the person named therein to fish in any of the said waters from the first day of October in any one year to the fifteenth day of April in the year following; but no such license shall confer any right of entry upon the land of any

any neuron of the same of the sam

Every such license shall entitle the person named therein to fish with rod and line only, and with the following baits: Natural or artificial fly, natural or artificial minnow and any small indigenous fish, grasshoppers, beetles, spiders, caterpillars, creepers, and worms.
 No person shall use any other bait, or any method, device, or contrivance of any sort or kind whatever for the purpose of fishing for, taking, catching, or killing trout, except a rod or line, and a landing-net or gaff for fish taken with rod and line.

with rod and line. 6. No cross-line fishing, stroke-hauling, or any other un-sportsmanlike device shall be used for the purpose of taking, catching, or killing trout; nor shall any of the baits abovementioned be used with any medicated or chemical preparation whatever. 7. No person shall take or attempt to take trout without

a license; and every person taking or attempt to take trout without a license; and every person taking or attempting to take trout shall, on demand of any ranger, constable, or person producing a license, produce and show to such ranger, con-stable, or person his license and the contents of his creel or bag, and the bait used by him for taking, catching, or killing trout.

8. Every trout not exceeding nine inches in length from nose to tip of tail, taken or caught by any person, shall im-mediately be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

same is taken.
9. No person shall put, throw, or place, or allow to be put, thrown, or placed in any of the said waters any sawdust or sawmill refuse, or anything of any kind or description whatever poisonons, deleterious, or noxious to fish. This shall not apply to débris or tailings from mining claims.
10. No person shall take, fish for, catch, or kill in any manner whatever, or have in his possession, any salmon, salmon parr or smolts, or the ova, young, or fry of any salmon in any stage whatever; and any of the abovenamed taken by accident or otherwise shall immediately be returned to the water from whence it was taken.
11. No person other than is provided by the regulations for taking lake trout shall sell, or expose or offer for sale, or

for taking lake trout shall sell, or expose or offer for sale, or for taking lake trout shall sell, or expose or other for sale, or have in his possession for purpose of sale, within the district to which these regulations relate, any of the salmonidæ, trout, perch, tench, or carp, or take, or fish for, catch, or kill any of the salmonidæ, trout, perch, tench, or carp, in order to make sale of same. 12. Any fish-dealer having on his business premises any of the salmonidæ, trout, perch, tench, or carp, shall be deemed to have them in his possession for the purpose of sale.

No person shall put, throw, drag, draw, or place, or allow to be put, thrown, dragged, drawn, or placed, for any purpose whatever, any net of any description (except a landing-net) in any of the rivers or streams in the said district, or within half a mile of the mouth or entrance of any such waters, except as may be provided in regulations authorising the taking of lake trout. 13. No person shall put, throw, drag, draw, or place, or allow

under six inches in length; nor shall any perch, tench, or carp be taken, caught, or killed at all, or had in possession of any person, between the sixteenth day of April and the

first day of December in any year. 16. The penalty for the breach of any of these regulations shall not be more than five pounds nor less than five shillings.
