Attempted Murder.

RUSSELL.—**Takirihī Kaupeka**, *alias* **D. H. Phillips**, is charged on warrant with having, on the 27th January, 1902, attempted to murder Agnes Tanui (*née* Cook), at Waikare, Bay of Islands. Description: A three-quarter-caste Maori, twenty-five years of age, 5 ft. 7 in. or 8 in. high, dark complexion, small round dark-brown eyes sunk back in head, dark heavy eyebrows, short nose, slight dark moustache, thick lips turned outwards, "Takirihī" tattooed on one of his arms, medium build, smart appearance. Is a good all-round bush-labourer. When last seen was wearing brown-coloured trousers, dark-tweed coat and vest, and soft light-felt hat. Supposed to be hiding in the bush.

Arson.

ROXBURGH.—About 12.5 a.m., 3rd instant, an attempt was made to burn the store kept by Louis Faigan, Miller's Flat. Kerosene had been spilt on the ground, and one of the weatherboards and a floor-joint partly burned. The stock and building were insured for £380, which was not considered excessive.

INGLEWOOD.—William Skelley, charged on warrant with default of fine for theft, has been arrested by Sergeant J. Dwyer, Wanganui police, and lodged in the Wanganui Gaol.

STRATFORD.—Herbert Snell, charged with obtaining credit by fraud, cashed the two £50 notes and the £5 notes at Eltham about the 30th ultimo.

HAWERA.—**George Booth** is charged on warrant with obtaining 10s. from Elizabeth A. Adams by false pretences on the 10th instant. Description: A labourer, about forty-five years of age, about 5 ft. 5 in. high, medium build, brown hair, bald on top of head, clean-shaved except moustache, has tattoo-marks on arms; dressed in dark coat and dungaree trousers, a white sweater, and a light-grey soft-felt hat. Supposed identical with Cornelius Tall, *alias* Booth, &c. (See *Police Gazette*, 1901, pages 78 and 266.) Supposed to have gone towards New Plymouth.

HAWERA.—James Dwyer, charged with obtaining credit by fraud from Arthur Albert Fanthan, arrived in Auckland from Wellington by the s.s. "Elingamite," and proceeded to Sydney by the same boat on the 20th ultimo, under the name of Mr. Knight. He was accompanied by Mrs. McFadgen, who stopped with him at the Grand Central, Sydney.

WANGANUI.—**P. Williams** (name probably fictitious) is charged on warrant with having, on the 15th instant, forged and uttered a cheque for £2 10s. to James Hodson, baker, Bell Street, Wanganui. Description: Supposed colonial, about twenty-eight years of age, about 5 ft. 9 in. high, slight build, sharp features and nose, sallow complexion, dark hair, dark moustache and side whiskers; dressed in shabby dark suit, brown soft hat; has a quiet manner, and generally keeps to himself. He came from Wellington, where he was known by the name of *Dickson*, and was employed for a week by Fraser, Smith, and Co., photographers, Wanganui, and forged their name to the cheque which he uttered.

WANGANUI.—**John Hughes** and **Selina Ann Hughes** are charged on warrant with incest at Wanganui on the 1st September, 1901. Descriptions—First: A native of England, sixty-two years of age, about 5 ft. 7 in. high, medium build, fresh complexion, grey hair and whiskers, upper and lower lips shaved; generally dressed in a dark-tweed suit, black soft-felt hat, white shirt, and black tie. Second: A native of New Zealand, twenty-eight years of age, about 5 ft. 2 in. high, fair hair and complexion, blue eyes, left hand deformed (no fingers on it); may be dressed in dark navy-blue dress, white-straw gem hat with black band. Left Palmerston North on 13th ultimo for Wellington, saying they were going to Christchurch. The female offender is the mother of two children said to be by her father, the male offender.

FEILDING.—**John Hargraves**, *alias* **Thomas Kavanagh**, is charged on warrants of commitment to Wanganui for three days in default of paying £1 15s., fine and costs for drunkenness. Description: A native of England, a cook and hotel rouseabout, thirty years of age, 5 ft. 6 in. high, slight build, rather sallow complexion, grey eyes, dark-brown hair, clean-shaved except dark-brown moustache, slightly prominent teeth; dressed in dark sac suit and cap. Carries a swag rolled up in a striped rug.

MASTERTON.—**William Mulligan** is charged on warrant of commitment to the Terrace Gaol, Wellington, for fourteen days in default of paying £1 17s. 6d., fine and costs for medical treatment for drunkenness. Description: About

fifty-six years of age, a cook and baker, 5 ft. 8½ in. high, stout build, grey hair whiskers and moustache, large nose turned on one side; dressed in a grey-tweed suit.

WELLINGTON.—**Bertie Grenville** is charged on warrant with false pretences on Peter Wilson, manager, City Buffet Hotel, on the 2nd instant. Description: A Jew, and generally works as a canvasser, and sometimes as a labourer, twenty-four years of age, 5 ft. 4 in. high, fresh complexion, light-brown hair, grey eyes, clean-shaved, and may be wearing a black- serge suit and hard black hat. Supposed to have gone by s.s. "Zealandia" to Dunedin on the 21st instant. Offender obtained £4 19s. from complainant by means of a valueless cheque. He is now on probation for theft. CHRISTCHURCH.—**Dougald Paterson** is charged on warrant with absconding from bail on the 14th instant. Description: A native of New Zealand, thirty-six years of age, 5 ft. 8 in. high, medium build, sallow complexion, clean-shaved, brown hair turning grey, active appearance, good address; was formerly bank clerk at Dunedin, where his parents reside. He was lately in partnership with Magnus and Co., gold-dredging brokers, &c., High Street, Christchurch, and was arrested for obtaining £12 10s. from Alfred Butcher by false pretences, and admitted to bail. He was staying at the Marine Hotel, Sumner, and left there on the 9th instant. When last seen was wearing a dark coat and vest and white slouch hat, and may have a rolled-gold chain and Waterbury watch.

DUNEDIN.—**George Cripps** is charged on warrant of commitment to Dunedin Gaol for forty-eight hours in default of paying 13s., fine and costs for drunkenness. Description: A native of Victoria, a plumber, thirty-five years of age, 5 ft. 7½ in. high, stout build, fair complexion, fair hair, blue eyes. Supposed to have gone shearing in Central Otago.

DUNEDIN.—**Frank James McKnight** is charged on warrant of commitment to Dunedin Gaol for fourteen days in default of paying £3 3s., fine and costs for assault. Description: A native of New Zealand, a labourer, twenty-four years of age, about 5 ft. 7 in. high, medium build, fresh complexion, auburn hair, grey eyes. Supposed to have gone South.

DUNEDIN.—**Victor Towsey** is charged on warrant of commitment to Dunedin Gaol for twenty-four hours in default of paying 5s. and costs for keeping an unregistered dog. Description: Colonial, about twenty years of age, a factory-hand, about 5 ft. 9 in. high, medium build, fresh complexion, brown hair, clean-shaved, blue eyes, long thin face, very long nose; usually dressed in brown-tweed suit. Supposed to have gone to Central Otago. There is now due the sum of 8s.

1. CLOTHING issued to members of the Force will be inspected as follows, viz.: At headquarter stations when men are paraded to receive their monthly pay, and at out-stations either by the officers in charge of districts, or by the sergeants in charge of sub-districts when making their periodical visits. The object of the inspection is to insure that the clothing is kept clean and in good condition.

2. In the event of any member dying or leaving the service, the following articles of the last free issue to such member are to be obtained and returned to the Police Storekeeper, Wellington, by officers in charge of districts, viz.:-

- Coats, night duty.
- Coats, waterproof (mounted or foot).
- Helmets.
- Leggings.
- Shakos.

The usual receipt and delivery vouchers, together with a memorandum showing the names of the members from whom the articles were obtained, and dates of issue, should be sent to the Storekeeper at the same time.

3. After the first free issue of clothing, buttons for jumpers will not be issued except to men who have had only one issue of clothing on joining the Force. In all other cases it is expected that the buttons will be transferred from worn-out jumpers to the new issue. This will permit of each man having two sets of buttons.

And for every such license to kill fallow deer a fee of £2 sterling will be charged; and no holder of any such license as aforesaid shall kill more than four bucks under or by virtue of such license.

An additional license to kill red deer may be issued to any person at a fee of £5, and no holder of such additional license shall kill more than four stags under or by virtue of such license, and no stag with less than eight points shall be killed.

The said Chief Postmaster is hereby appointed and authorised to issue and sign the said licenses.

2. Every such license shall entitle the person named therein to kill fallow deer (bucks only), as provided in Regulation No. 1, from the 15th March, 1902, to the 30th April, 1902, and red deer (stags only), as provided in Regulation No. 1, from the 1st April, 1902, to the 31st May, 1902. Ball cartridge only to be used.

3. No doe, hind, or fawn will be allowed to be killed on any pretext whatever, and no dogs will be allowed to accompany either the licensee or any attendant he may have with him.

4. The licensee must give notice to the said Chief Postmaster of the date on which it is his intention to stalk deer; such notice to be posted, or delivered, or telegraphed three clear days before such date.

5. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorising any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.

6. No deer shall be shot within an area containing about 24,800 acres in one block, being parts of the Mid-Hawea, Longlip, Lower Hawea, and Lindis Districts, plans of which area will be issued by the Secretary of the Otago Acclimatisation Society to persons to whom licenses to shoot deer are granted.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by "The Animals Protection Act, 1880," and "The Animals Protection Act Amendment Act, 1881," I, Uchter John Mark, Earl of Ranfurly, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby notify that deer (bucks or stags only) may be shot and killed within the boundaries of the Waitaki and Waimate Acclimatisation Society's district, subject to the following regulations and restrictions, namely:—

REGULATIONS.

1. Licenses to shoot and kill deer (bucks or stags only) in the Waitaki and Waimate Acclimatisation Society's district will be issued under the hand of the Chief Postmaster at Oamaru, on the recommendation of the Secretary of the Waitaki and Waimate Acclimatisation Society. The said Chief Postmaster is hereby appointed and authorised to issue and sign the said licenses.

2. Every such license shall entitle the person named therein to kill fallow deer (bucks only), as provided in Regulation No. 1, from the 15th March, 1902, to the 30th April, 1902, and red deer (stags only), as provided in Regulation No. 1, from the 1st April, 1902, to the 31st May, 1902. Ball cartridge only to be used.

3. No doe, hind, or fawn will be allowed to be killed on any pretext whatever, and no dogs will be allowed to accom-

pany either the licensee or any attendant he may have with him.

4. The licensee must give notice to the said Chief Postmaster of the date on which it is his intention to stalk deer; such notice to be posted, or delivered, or telegraphed three clear days before such date.

5. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorising any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.
