## PERSONS WANTED.

AUCKLAND.—14th ultimo, on **warrant** for a breach of the Bankruptcy Act, **Benjamin Harris**, age about forty-five, height about 5 ft. 3 in., a Polish Jew, sallow complexion, consumptive appearance, dark straight hair, dark moustache only, about 8st. weight; speaks broken English. He carried on business as a draper, and may have gone to South Africa *via* Sydney.

AUCKLAND.—20th September last, on **warrant** of commitment to Mount Eden Prison for twelve hours in default of paying 14s. fine and costs for failing to send her child to school, **Emily Meynell**, age forty-five, height 5 ft. 3 in., native of England, medium build, sallow complexion, dark hair, dirty untidy appearance; generally dresses in black.
