PERSONS WANTED.

AUCKLAND. -- 14th ultimo, on warrant for a breach of the Bankruptcy Act, **Benjamin Harris**, age about fortyfive, height about 5 ft. 3 in., a Polish Jew, sallow complexion, consumptive appearance, dark straight hair, dark moustache only, about 8st. weight; speaks broken English. He carried on business as a draper, and may have gone to South Africa viâ Sydney.
