## PLUNKET, Governor.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in me by "The Animals Protection Act, 1880," and the Acts amending the same, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby declare that from and after the date hereof hares shall cease to be within the operation of the said Acts within the area described in the Schedule hereto.

## SCHEDULE.

AREA IN WHICH HARES MAY BE TAKEN OR KILLED.

ALL that area in the Wellington Land District, situated in Kaitawa and Waitohu Survey Districts, bounded towards the north-east by the Otaki River from the sea to a point opposite the westernmost corner of Section No. 7a, in Block IV, Kaitawa Survey District; thence by a right line across the Otaki River to the westernmost corner of the said Section No. 7a, thence by the north-eastern boundary-lines of Sections Nos. 7a, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11. 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, and 17, Block IV, Kaitawa Survey District, to the easternmost corner of the last-mentioned section; thence towards the south-east by Section No. 18, Block V, Taungata Survey District, to the Otaki River; thence by the said Otaki River to its confluence with the southern branch of that river at

the northernmost corner of Section No. 3, Block XII, Kaitawa Survey District; thence by the southern branch of the said Otaki River to the north-eastern boundary-line of Section No. 6, Block XII aforesaid; thence by the lastmentioned section to its northernmost corner; thence across a road and by Sections Nos. 3 and 5, Block XII aforesaid, Sections Nos. 4 and 1, Block XI, Section No. 60, Block X, Kaitawa Survey District, and the production of the north-eastern boundary-line of the last-mentioned section to the sea; and thence towards the north west by the sea to the place of commencement.
