## PERSONS WANTED.

Auckland.—15th January last, on **warrant** for failing to provide for the maintenance of his daughter, **William John Blair**, age thirty-four, height 5 ft. 10½ in., circus performer, native of New Zealand, medium build, blue eyes, black curly hair, very square shoulders. Is known as "Hercules."

AUCKLAND.—25th December last, on warrant for disobeying an order of Court to pay 10s. a week for the maintenance of his wife, at Auckland, Henry David Bloxham, alias Harry Bloxham, alias F. S. Whyatt, age thirty-three, height 5 ft. 7 in., sailor, native of England, stout build, dark eyes and hair, clean-shaved, sunburnt appearance, scars on both arms and end of right thumb, rolling gait; generally wears light-coloured coat and pants, and soft-felt hat. Is said to have been in Sydney, his address being "care of Mission to Seamen." He is now supposed to have returned to Auckland. On the 19th ultimo he was £6 in arrears. Waihi.—28th ultimo, on warrant for forgery, J. Edwards (name supposed fictitious), age about twenty-eight, height 5 ft. 5 in. or 6 in., labourer, medium build, about 11 st. weight, fair complexion, sandy hair, clean-shaved except sandy moustache; dressed in brown coat and trousers, brown vest of different material with blue spots, tan boots; was wearing a gold band ring with "A.F." engraved on it; had a portmanteau with "Fraser" engraved on silver plate thereon. Supposed gone to Te Karaka, where he has two mates named Paddy Ryan and Trueman. Offender received

an order from Richard Feiney, miner, to draw £2 12s. from the Waihi Gold-mining Company. He changed the order to £12 12s. and obtained a cheque for that amount.

Waihi.—8th instant, on warrant for deserting his wife, Ada Manning, Waihi, Robert Manning, age twenty-three, height 5 ft. 10 in. or 11 in., medium erect build, a miner and bushman, fair complexion and hair, clean-shaved, sharp features, blue eyes, "R. M." tattooed on left arm, and "R.M.S. 5370" on right arm, right little finger crooked; dressed in dark clothes and black hard hat. Supposed gone to Auckland. He left Waihi with Robert Reycroft, who is about nineteen years of age, about 5 ft. 6 in. high, medium build, long dark curly hair, dark complexion, and bow-legged.
