

4. Answers must be written on one side of the paper, with one-third margin. The answer to each question will be commenced on a fresh sheet of paper; the number of the question will be given at the top of the sheet, and the constable's name and register number at the bottom.

5. When candidates have answered all the questions they can, or when the time is up, they will fasten all their papers together, and hand them to the supervisor.

2. The questions will be sent from this office in sealed covers, to be opened in the presence of the candidates at the hours prescribed, and they can be kept by the candidates.
