Totalisators.

The Solicitor-General advises that the practice adopted by some racing clubs of having more than three totalisators at work at their meetings, and declaring one dividend on the total amount invested on the various machines, is contrary to section 46, subsection (3), of "The Gaming and Lotteries Act, 1881."

The Police will notify all secretaries of clubs where such machines are used in excess of the number allowed by law that in the event of that number being exceeded in future action will be taken.

Rotorua Acclimatisation District extended.

PLUNKET, Governor.

WHEREAS by a Warrant made under "The Animals Protection Act, 1880," dated the eighteenth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and seven, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the twenty-fourth day of the said month of January, the Rotorus Acclimatisation District was constituted with the boundaries therein defined: And whereas it is expedient to extend the said district by including therein the existing Wairoa Acclimatisation District and also a portion of the County of Whakatane:

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by "The Animals Protection Act, 1880," and the Acts amending the same, do hereby abolish the Rotorua and Wairoa Acclimatisation Districts as heretofore constituted, and in lieu thereof do hereby appoint those parts of the said colony described in the Schedule hereto to be a district under and for the purposes of the said Acts; and I do further declare that such district shall be known as the "Rotorua Acclimatisation District."

SCHEDULE.

ROTORUA ACCLIMATISATION DISTRICT.

ALL that area bounded towards the north by the Tauranga County from the north-eastern boundary of Piako County

to the western boundary of Whakatane County; thence towards the east by Whakatane County to the summit of Mount Ahiwhakamura; thence towards the north-east by a right line to the summit of Mount Tawhiuau; thence by a right line to the summit of Mount Maungapohatu; thence by the watershed between Waikaremoana and the Ruakituri River to the northern boundary of Wairoa County; thence by the north-eastern boundary of the said Wairoa County to the sea; thence towards the east and south-east generally by the sea to Moeangiangi; thence towards the south generally by the leading spur and the southern watershed of the Waikare River to Taraponui Mountain; thence by the leading spur to the confluence of the Mohaka River with the Waipunga River; thence by a right line to Tataraokino Mountain; thence by the eastern watershed of the Mokomokonui Stream to Pohokina Mountain; thence by a line running due east to the Pukahunui Stream; thence by the leading spur and the western watershed of the Te Hoe River to Maungataniwha Trig.
