PERSONS WANTED.

PONSONBY.—Between 30th December and 1st ultimo, on **warrant** for theft of a gold bangle, a gold ring, and a dark-grey overcoat, value £7, property of the Rev. Francis Thomas (ring and bangle recovered), **G. Wilson** (name probably fictitious), age about thirty, height about 5 ft. 5 in., supposed colonial, slight build, very dark complexion, black hair, clean-shaved; wearing dark-grey sac coat, serge trousers, and hard black hat.
