PERSONS WANTED.

AUCKLAND.—21st July last, on **warrant** for disobeying an order of the Court to pay 10s. a week for the maintenance of his wife, **Thomas O'Neill**, age forty-three, height about 6 ft. 2 in., labourer and bush contractor, stout build, ruddy complexion, fair hair, light-blue eyes, fair heavy moustache.
