A description of property supposed to be stolen, found in the possession of offenders, for which owners cannot be found, should be furnished for insertion in the *Gazette*.

All communications concerning this *Gazette* should be addressed to the Commissioner of Police, Wellington, and the envelope marked "For *Gazette*." Members of the Force in charge of out-stations will forward them *direct*.

PERSONS WANTED.

AUCKLAND.—6th instant, that he may be compelled to provide for the maintenance of his child, **John McCarthy**, age thirty-four, height 5 ft. 6 in., organ-grinder, fresh complexion, auburn hair, blind. Is supposed to be living with a woman named Maher. (See *Police Gazette*, 1909, page 235, where he is wanted on two warrants of commitment.)

AUCKLAND.—30th ultimo, that she may be compelled to contribute towards the support of her child in the Auckland Industrial School, **Maria Cash Anderson**, age fifty, height 5 ft. 2 in., prostitute, native of Sweden, stout build, fair complexion, brown hair, hazel eyes. Police Gaol proclaimed.

PLUNKET, Governor.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Prisons Act, 1908," it is enacted that the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare that such police-stations as he shall name therein shall be police-gaols:

And whereas it is desirable to proclaim the police-station situated in Churton Street, at Wanganui, to be a policegaol:

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority conferred upon me by the said Act, and of every other power and authority contract authority enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that, from and after the gazetting of this Proclamation, the police-station situated in Churton Street, at Wanganui, shall be a policegaol.

> Given under the hand of His Excellency the Right en under the hand of his Excenency the Knight Honourable William Lee, Baron Plunket, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Go-vernor and Commander-in-Chief in and over His Majesty's Dominion of New Zealand and its Development in the Saint of the Saint State of Dependencies; and issued under the Seal of the said Dominion, at the Government House, at Wellington, this tenth day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and nine.

Proclaiming Prison closed.

PLUNKET, Governor.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Prisons Act, 1908," it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation, declare that any prison shall no longer be a prison, and upon the gazetting of such Proclamation, or from and after any later date fixed therein, such prison shall cease to be a prison :

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority conferred upon me by the said Act, and of every other power and authority enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that, from and after the gazetting of this Proclamation, the prison at Wanganui shall cease to be a prison.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Right Honourable William Lee, Baron Plunket, Knigh Commander of the Most Distinguished Ordes of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Go-vernor and Commander-in-Chief in and over His Mainetry's Dominion of New Zeeland and its His Majesty's Dominion of New Zealand and its Dependencies ; and issued under the Seal of the said Dominion, at the Government House, at Wellington, this tenth day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and nine.
