LAW REPORT.

("N.Z. Law Reports," Vol. xxviii, pages 502, 503, and 504.)
REX v. O'KEEFE.

Criminal Law—Practice—Indictment—Adding Count—Distinct Offence—Not disclosed by Depositions—Leave of Judge—Ground upon which given—"The Crimes Act, 1908," Section 407.

Semble, That where, after an accused person has been committed for trial, the consent of a Judge is asked ex parte, under section 407 of "The Crimes Act, 1908," to add a count to the indictment to be preferred against him, charging him with an offence not disclosed in the depositions and not investigated in the Court below, the Judge has jurisdiction to give such consent; but such jurisdiction should only be exercised upon sufficient prima facie evidence being placed before him.

The accused was committed for trial upon a charge of stealing two sheep. After his committal the consent of a Judge was asked for by the Crown ex parte to add a count in the indictment to be preferred against him, charging him also with stealing a lamb. No mention of this lamb had been made during the investigation before the Magistrate, and the depositions contained no reference to this charge. In support of the application an affidavit by a detective was read, stating that after the accused was committed for trial his premises had been searched, and the skin of a lamb found at the bottom of his sheep-dip, which had been identified as the property of the prosecutor. The consent to add the count was granted.

Myers for the Crown and contra.

COOPER, J.:-

It is unfortunate that there has been no reported ruling of this Court upon an application of this description, but I think that the Court had jurisdiction to give consent, and that it properly exercised its discretion. Reg. v. Bradlaugh (15 Cox C.C. 217) does not apply. That case was under the Vexatious Indictments Act, but, even so, the remarks of Mr. Justice Hawkins rather tend to support the exercise of the discretion of the Court in a case like this than to negative it. In that case there was no reference in the depositions to the counts which were afterwards added, nor was there any reference in the depositions in this case. The Recorder in that case gave leave to add two other counts for libel, but no material had been placed before him. This was the reason why the rule was made absolute. There was a mere general suggestion that the defendant Bradlaugh had pub-lished some other libel, but no evidence of such libel was placed before the Recorder, nor any evidence tending to show that any such libel had been published. In the present case there was a clear intimation by Mr. Myers, which is not disputed, that the circumstances which are stated in Mr. Broberg's affidavit did not appear on the depositions, and that the charge which I gave leave to add was not founded on the depositions, and, further, the material upon which it was asked to found the count was properly laid before me. In Mr. Broberg's affidavit he says, "I searched the premises of John O'Keefe after O'Keefe was committed for trial, and obtained from the bottom of his sheep-dip the skin of a lamb, which has been identified by Robert Henry Robinson as the property of Arthur Martin." That is to say, Broberg found upon the premises of the prisoner the skin of a lamb belonging to the prosecutor. That is sufficient prima facie evidence to justify the adding of a count. It is, of course, possible that during the progress of the trial it may appear to the Court that some injustice may arise if this count should go to the jury. The Court may then quash the count, and it is quite clear that if Mr. Skerrett asks the Court for a severance of the counts, and that this count should not go before a jury with the other counts, and that the trial should be postponed on this particular count, I should sever the charge. I did not make this order without carefully considering the circumstances. I was reluctant to make it, and I did not make it until I had searched for a precedent in this Court, and I found that an order upon similar material had been granted by Sir James Prendergast in Regina v. Brown, a case which has not been reported. In that case the indictment was for abortion. The Crown applied ex parte to add a count to a bill of indictment alleging another act of abortion. No evidence of this further Act was disclosed upon the depositions. The evidence had been discovered since the accused person was committed for trial, and the material His Honour acted upon was an affidavit establishing a prima facie case of the further alleged act of abortion. His Honour granted the leave, and the grand jury found a true bill upon both charges. Mr. Jellicoe moved to quash the second count, and after argument the motion was dismissed. I think the case of Reg. v. Bradlaugh is clearly distinguishable, and that the remarks of Mr. Justice Hawkins really go a long way to answer Mr. Skerrett's argument. I shall follow the case of Reg. v. Brown and dismiss the motion. If it is suggested that the least injustice may arise to the prisoner through adding this count, if a severance is asked for in this case I shall grant it, and if an adjournment on this count is asked for, there are, in my opinion, strong reasons for granting such an adjournment.

Skerrett, K.C.—I do not ask for a severance, and I am prepared now to go to trial on the added count.

Regulations for Licenses to take Seals.

PLUNKET, Governor.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this twelfth day of July, 1909.

Present:

THE HONOURABLE JAMES CARROLL PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

W HEREAS it is provided by section forty-two of "The Fisheries Act, 1908" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), that the Governor in Council may from time to time make regulations for the purposes set forth in such sections:

And whereas it is desirable for the purposes of the said |

section to make the regulations hereinafter set forth:
Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations, namely :-

REGULATIONS.

1. Licenses to take seals may be issued in respect of the lands belonging to the Crown (including any lands below high-water mark) on the Snares, Auckland, Campbell, Antipodes, and Bounty Islands respectively; and one license may be issued for the Snares, Auckland, Antipodes, and Bounty Islands, and a separate license for Campbell Island.

2. The licenses shall be disposed of by public tander, and the standard of the public tander.

2. The licenses shall be disposed of by public tender, and the licensees shall have the sole right, during the open season, to take seals on the islands included in their licenses. Licenses shall be for a period of ten years, without any right of renewal, and shall be in the form set forth in the Schedule hereto.

3. No female seals shall be killed or taken.

4. No bull seals under twelve months old shall be killed or taken, and a sufficient number of full-grown bulls shall be

left for breeding purposes.

5. The licensee and his employees shall travel to and from the islands included in the license by a Government steamer, and all skins shall be brought away from the islands by such a steamer. The licensee shall pay seven shillings and six-pence a day for each passenger for saloon passages, and five shillings a day for each passenger for forecabin passages, and two pounds a ton for freight on stores taken to the islands and on skins brought therefrom.

6. The licensee shall pay a royalty of ten shillings on each fur-seal, and a royalty of one shilling on each hair-seal

taken.

7. Tenderers shall state the sum per annum they will pay, in addition to the royalty, for the right to take seals.

8. Not more than 4,500 fur-seals and 4,500 hair-seals shall be taken by the licensee during the first year of his license on the Snares, Auckland, Antipodes, and Bounty Islands; and not more than 500 fur-seals and 500 hair-seals shall be taken during the first year by the licensee on Campbell Island. In succeeding years the numbers that may be taken shall be fixed by the Minister, who shall have the right at shall be fixed by the Minister, who shall have the right at any time to reduce the number that may be taken, and he, or any officer appointed by him, shall have power to regulate the number that may be taken on each island and from each rookery. Before the skins are shipped from the Island on which they are taken any officer appointed by the Minister shall have the right to inspect them.

9. All skins taken in contravention of "The Fisheries Act, 1908," or of the license shall be forfeited to the Crown, and the Minister may declare the license forfeited if the licensee commits a breach of the law or of the conditions of his

10. Skins which have been forfeited shall be sold by public auction, and the proceeds shall be paid into and form part of

the Consolidated Fund.

11. The licensee and two sureties approved by the Minister shall enter into a bond for two thousand pounds in the case of the license for the Snares, Auckland, Antipodes, and Bounty Islands, and for three hundred pounds in the case of the license for Campbell Island, for the due performance of the terms and conditions of the license and the

several regulations affecting the same.

In these regulations the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine appointed under the provisions of "The

Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908."
