NEW YORK (AMERICA). — Wanted for murder, Leong Lum or Lin, or Leon Ling, alias Leong Chon Wing, American name, William L. Leon. Description: Chinaman, thirty years old, not more than 5 ft. 4 in. high, weighs 125 lbs., smooth face, good teeth, black hair, deep-set black eyes, when last seen his hair was cut American style. He is of very slim build and consumptive-looking, he has high cheek-bones, and his cheeks are sunken, he has a prominent sharp chin, he talks good English; dressed in black clothes, wore a ring on ring-finger of left hand, and was very well dressed. He had a fondness for Chinese-silk shirts with snaps on instead of buttons, and for low-cut patent-leather shoes, which be wore laced down from the top with the bow tied at the bottom eyelet-holes. He may now be wearing Chinese costume and have on a false queue. When excited has a habit of frowning or knitting his eyebrows. Is slightly round shouldered. PURSUANT to the powers vested in me by "The Animals Protection Act, 1908," I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby notify and declare that the areas described in the Schedule hereto shall be sanctuaries for the purposes of the said Animals Protection Act, and that no imported game or native game shall be taken or killed within the said areas.
