PERSONS WANTED.

AUCKLAND.—19th instant, on **warrant** for deserting from the barque "Caracciolo," **Ereole Amorethi**, age nineteen, height 5 ft. 6 in., sailor, native of Italy, medium build, sallow complexion, dark hair, brown eyes.

AUCKLAND.—7th October, 1908, on **warrant** for theft of a bicycle, the property of John Edward Murson, cycle agent, value £4, **Robert W. Description: Age forty-six, height about 6 ft., labourer, thin build, long thin features, dark complexion, dark hair turning grey, dark moustache, may be clean-shaved; poorly dressed in dark clothes, and wears a black hard hat. He was engaged by Messrs. J. J. Craig at their sheds on the Railway Wharf. On the 5th May last he was injured, and sent to the hospital, and was discharged on the 8th May, and was seen in Auckland on the 10th ultimo. He is now said to have shipped for England. (09/1687.)
