PERSONS WANTED.

MURDER: £100 REWARD.

WELLINGTON. — Whereas on the morning of the 27th December, 1908, the dead body of one **J. H. McCormack**, a sailor, was found near His Majesty's Theatre, Courtenay Place, Wellington, and whereas at a Coroner's inquest held on the 4th January, 1909, a verdict was returned that deceased came to his death by violence at the hands of some person or persons unknown:

Notice is hereby given that a reward of £100 will be paid to any person (not the actual perpetrator) who first gives such information as will lead to the apprehension and conviction of the person or persons who caused or took part in causing the deceased's death.
