PERSONS WANTED.

Auckland.—12th March last, on warrant of commitment to Auckland Prison for twell y four hours in default of paying 8s. fine and costs for drunkenness, James Kelly, age thirty-eight, height 5 ft. 8½ in., labourer, native of Ireland, medium build, fresh complexion, fair hair, blue eyes.

DARGAVILLE.—14th ultimo, on warrant for false pretences on Harry Moyle, contractor, John Petley, age twenty-six, height 5 ft. 16 in., bushman, native of New Zealand, thin face, sandy hair, fair complexion, longish fair moustache, no hair immediately under the nostrils; dressed in dark-blue vicuna suit and greenish tweed hat; fond of horses. Offender was employed by complainant bushfelling, and obtained £2 10s. by falsely representing that he had worked a full week, when he had only worked one day.
