PERSONS WANTED.

AUCKLAND.—2nd instant, on **warrant** to compel his attendance as a witness in the licensing case, *Police v. Bach*, **Thomas Quinn**, age forty-five, height 5 ft. 10½ in., labourer, native of New South Wales, strong build, sandy complexion, ginger hair, blue eyes, scars on nose and forehead; dressed in light-coloured suit and Panama hat. He is supposed to have gone to Taranaki. He has a brother working on the railway at Stratford. His wife lives at Denniston or Westport. Offender was served with a summons for the 26th ultimo, but failed to appear, and stated his intention to clear out.

AUCKLAND.—23rd March last, on **warrant** for false pretences, **W. Daniels**, age about forty, height about 5 ft. 7 in., or 8 in., plasterer, native of England, stout build, fresh complexion, short thick neck, dark hair turning grey, moustache only, sleepy eyes, flat-footed, dressed in dark-grey clothes, hard-felt hat, has a habit of humming and singing when in company. Offender obtained £6 from Susan Russell, boardinghouse-keeper, by means of a valueless cheque. He was one of the firm of Kent and Daniels, plasterers, Wellington. Another charge pending.

Williams**, age fifty, height 5 ft. 5 in., stationer, native of England, medium build, fresh complexion, blue eyes, dark hair. He has paid 10s., leaving a balance now due of £4 13s.

AUCKLAND.—11th ultimo, on **warrant** for being a rogue and vagabond, **Will H. Matthews**, age thirty-three, height 5 ft. 7 in., supposed chemist, native of New Zealand, medium build, brown hair, brown eyes, fair moustache; dressed in blue-coloured suit. Offender obtained £5 from Robert Watson by falsely representing that he had an account in the Bank of New South Wales, Auckland; and also by representing that he was a purchaser for 105 acres of land uttered a valueless cheque on the Bank of New South Wales, Auckland, to Mary Glass. WAIPAWA.—6th ultimo, on **warrant** for deserting his wife, Gisella Theresa Lambert, at Waipawa, **Alfred Lambert**, age thirty, height 5 ft. 5 in., coach-driver, native of New Zealand, medium active build, light-brown curly hair, slight brown moustache. Offender was seen in Palmerston North about the middle of March last, in company with an ex-barmaid named McLennan, and is supposed to have gone to Rotorua.

Blowers** (known as **Bill Blowers**), age about twenty-seven, height 5 ft. 6 in., labourer, native of New Zealand, stout build, fair complexion, fair hair, clean-shaved; generally dressed in dark-tweed suit. Supposed to have come to the North Island. Complainant, Annie Helen McIsaacs.

AHAURA.—14th ultimo, that a summons may be served on him for using obscene language, **John Corrilli**, age about thirty-five, height about 5 ft. 5 in., native of Scotland, medium build, fresh complexion, dark-brown hair, large blue eyes, large feet, slight cant in one eye; generally dressed in greenish-coloured suit and cap; fond of drink; a Socialist lecturer. Supposed gone to Dennistown.

Offender had a billiard-room in Wellington at one time, and is now thought to be working at some freezing-works in the North Island.

CHRISTCHURCH.—29th March last, on warrant of commitment to Lyttelton Prison for six months for failing to comply with an order of the Court to pay 5s. a week towards the support of his wife, **William James Green**, age thirty-five, height 5 ft. 6½ in., labourer, native of England, florid complexion, brown hair, grey eyes, large nose. CHRISTCHURCH.—January or February last, on warrant for theft of seven bottles of kapoc, value £15 6s. LAW REPORT.

[IN THE COURT OF APPEAL.]

REX v. SMITH.

("N.Z. Law Reports," Vol. xxix, page 244.)

Criminal Law—False Declaration—Purporting to be under Justices of the Peace Act—Essential Part of Form omitted—Not under Act—The Justices of the Peace Act, 1908, Section 289—Whether a Crime under the Crimes Act, 1908, Section 133—Slight Deviation from Prescribed Forms—The Acts Interpretation Act, 1908, Section 6 (h).

The accused made a false declaration before a Justice of the Peace and purporting to be under the Justices of the Peace Act, 1908. The declaration contained these words: "And I make this solemn declaration conscientiously believing the same to be true," but the words "and by virtue of the Justices of the Peace Act, 1908," were omitted.

Held by the Court of Appeal, That the words omitted were essential to the validity of a declaration under the Justices of the Peace Act; that the declaration was therefore not made under the Act; and that the accused could not be convicted of the offence prescribed by section 289 of making a false declaration under that Act.

Per *Denniston* and *Cooper, JJ.*—The accused in making the declaration probably committed an offence under

section 133 of the Crimes Act, 1908, and upon a proper indictment under that section could have been properly convicted.

CASE reserved by *Denniston, J.*, under section 422 of the Crimes Act, 1908, for the opinion of the Court of Appeal. The following is a copy of the case stated:—

The accused was charged on an indictment that he did wilfully and unlawfully make a false declaration before a Justice of the Peace in and for the Dominion of New Zealand to the effect that he, the said John William Smith, had lost certain pawn-tickets. It was admitted that accused had signed and made the underwritten document.

"New Zealand, Christchurch, to wit. I, John William Smith, of Christchurch, do solemnly and sincerely declare that in the month of June, 1909, I pledged with W. J. Grand five medals and chain, on which the said W. J. Grand, pawnbroker, advanced to the said J. W. Smith the sum of £2 10s., and at the same time gave me duplicates for the same. And I also declare that the said duplicates received as aforesaid were lost by me, and I do declare that I have not made any improper use of the said duplicates. And I make this solemn declaration conscientiously believing the same to be true—

"J. W. SMITH.

"Declared before me at Christchurch, July 9th, 1909—

"W. BARNETT, J.P.

"No. of duplicates lost, 7039 and 7042."

It was admitted that the statement in such document is untrue, and was known by the accused to be untrue, and that if the document is a declaration under section 287 of the Justices of the Peace Act, 1908, the accused was guilty of the offence charged in the indictment. The jury, on my direction, found the accused guilty. The accused having been three months in gaol since his arrest, I ordered him to enter into his own recognisance to come up for sentence when called upon. I reserved for the consideration of the Court of Appeal the question if, in the absence from the document of the words "and by virtue of the Justices of the Peace Act, 1908," the document is a valid declaration under section 287 of the Justices of the Peace Act, 1908.

WILLIAMS, A.C.J.:—

The prisoner was indicted under section 289 of the Justices of the Peace Act, 1908, which provides that if any declaration made under this Act is false or untrue in any material particular, the person wilfully making such false declaration is guilty of perjury. In order to support a conviction under section 289 a declaration must be made under the Act. The only declaration which can be made under the Act is that referred to in sections 286 and 287—that is, the declaration set out in form No. 50 in the Second Schedule of the Act. That form has not been followed in the present case. The words "and by virtue of the Justices of the Peace Act, 1908," which occur in the form have been omitted from the declaration which the prisoner made. In my opinion, the omission of these words amounts to a great deal more than a slight deviation from the prescribed form within the meaning of section 6, clause (h), in the Acts Interpretation Act, 1908, which is as follows: "Wherever forms are prescribed slight deviations therefrom, but to the same effect and not calculated to mislead, shall not vitiate them." Here these words are an essential part of the form. It must appear to the person who makes the declaration and to the person before whom it is made that it is made in pursuance of the particular statute under which it purports to be made. The point is a narrow one, but on the whole I am satisfied that the objection taken to the omission of these words is sound. The only question reserved is whether, these words being absent from the document, it is a valid declaration. Mr. Myers suggested that the accused might be convicted under section 133 of the Crimes Act, 1908. The indictment, however, was not framed under that section, and the course of proceeding at the trial was not such as would or ought to have been followed if it was intended to charge the prisoner under that section. Further than that, the question whether he could be convicted under that section has not been reserved for our consideration. I am therefore of opinion that the conviction must be quashed.

Conviction quashed.
