PERSONS WANTED.

AUCKLAND.—2nd instant, on warrant to compel his attendance as a wither in the licenting case, Police v. Bach, Thomas Quinn, age forty-five, height 5 ft. 10½ in., labourer, native of New South Wales, strong build, sandy complexion, ginger hair, blue eyes, scars on nose and forchead; dressed in light-coloured suit and Paoama hat. He is supposed to have gone to Taranaki. He has a brother working on the railway at Stratford. His wife lives at Denniston or Westport. Offender was served with a summons for the 26th ultimo, but failed to appear, and stated his intention to clear out.

Auckland.—23rd March last, on warrant for false pretences, W. Daniels, age about forly, height about 5 ft. 7 in. or 3 in., plasterer, native of England, stout build, fresh complexion, short thick neck, dark hair turning grey, moustache only, sleepy eyes flat footed, dressed in dark-grey clothes, hard-felt hat has a habit of humming and singing when in company. Offender obtained £6 from Susan Russell, boardinghouse-keeper, by means of a valuless cheque. He was one of the firm of Kent and Daniels, plasterers, Wellington. Another charge pending.

Williams, age fitty, height 5 ft. 5 in., stationer, native of England, medium build, fresh complexion, blue eyes, dark hair. He has paid 10s., leaving a balance now due of £4 13s.
